About our school

The Winnipeg Adult Education Centre (WAEC) consists of a main campus, the Adolescent Parent Centre, four Adult Learning Centres; Kaakiyow li moond likol, the WAEC Off-Campus Site, Taking Charge of Academics, T.E.R.F. (Transition, Education & Resources for Females) and an off-site English as an Additional Language Program. Each of these sites serves a different demographic of our student population.

The WAEC offers high school educational opportunities to adult students seeking to complete a grade 12 diploma, upgrade for post-secondary and/or strengthen employment opportunities. Since 1968, the WSD has operated the WAEC as a strategy to improve graduation rates in the WSD. It also serves as an anti-poverty strategy improving educational outcomes for hundreds of Indigenous and Newcomer students. Primarily offering the Mature Student Diploma, approximately 200 students graduate per year and hundreds more upgrade to meet post-secondary requirements. Many students also use their diploma to improve their prospects for entering the work force. The Adolescent Parent Centre provides high school education to pregnant and parenting adolescents and young women. Child Care is provided for students while they attend school. Three significant initiatives have been implemented this year to address the challenge of engagement and credit attainment. The WAEC offers a true continuous intake model, is implementing PLAR and launched a Learn Anywhere model bringing curriculum to students electronically including streaming classes.

The Winnipeg Adult Education Centre- "Learning Happens Here."

Highlights

- During the COVID 19 Pandemic and the suspension of classes the WAEC provided a robust online program including live streamed lessons, online resource support, small group virtual meetings, blogs and instruction and assessment through online platforms.
- The WAEC hosted a day of celebration for our graduating students. This included diploma presentation, a graduation cap and tassel as well as having their picture taken on our front lawn with a WAEC graduation sign.
- 178 students graduated in June 2020 and many more took advantage of opportunities to upgrade for entrance into the workforce or post-secondary education.
- Continuous Intake Program that allows students to register at any time and increases student engagement and credit attainment. This program provides instruction and assessment, mentorship and collaboration opportunities.
- Daily resource support in core subject areas.
- Cohort skill building program that focusses on preparing students for credit courses and providing opportunities for success.
- Food Fridays' where students are provided with coffee and snacks
- Free breakfast offered to students during exams
- Holiday dinner served by staff to all students
- Career Exploration Program saw the Career Advisor meet individually with over 100 students to discuss their job
- Continued growth of our Learn Anywhere initiative bringing curriculum to students electronically.
- Active blog sites on course material including video tutorials and lessons.
- Website student tab that includes instructor approved links and student spotlight section
- Online instruction, assessment and support for all courses
- Students were educated on Traditional Plant Use and the medicinal properties of plants native to Manitoba and in our own Circle Garden
- Orange Shirt Day Celebration
- Inuit and Metis class presentations on cultures
- Field trips to Manitoba Museum, Winnipeg Art Gallery, Human Rights Museum, Law Courts, RRC Open House and Fort Whyte
- CPR Emergency First Aid training for students
- Biology Students participated in the 4 day Bio Youth Program where they had the opportunity to explore and experience biomedical science in a world class research center.
- Science students participated in the Arctic Science Day at Fort Whyte where they were able to take part in hands on learning led by experts in the areas of environmental science.
- Canadian politician, nurse, educator and entrepreneur Uzoma Asagwara, presented to staff and students.
