Overall Numeracy Goals:

- A minimum of 2-3 published pieces from a variety of writing genres of the teacher's choice by April 2019.
- 3. Students will reread their writing to revise and edit their ideas and pieces with the six traits in mind.

Indigenous Learning Goals:

- All students will demonstrate knowledge of Indigenous cultures in Manitoba and Canada
- All students will demonstrate knowledge of Residential Schools in Canadian history
- 3. All students will have the opportunity to continue to showcase their work throughout the school



Priorities for 2019-2020

- OVERALL READING GOALS for 2019-2020:
- 1. 60% of students will show a year within a year's growth in reading.
- 2. All students will increase their repertoire of comprehension strategies (grade specific) that will help them become stronger readers.

3. All students will be able to select 'good fit' books for a variety of purposes and sustain grade appropriate reading stamina.

OVERALL WRITING GOALS for 2019-2020:

1. 80% of students will show a year within a year's growth in writing

2. A minimum of 4-5 published pieces from a variety of writing genres of the teacher's choice by end of the school year

3. Students will reread their writing to revise and edit their ideas and pieces with the six traits in mind.

OVERALL NUMERACY GOALS FOR 2019 - 2020:

1. By June 2020, students will use mathematical language by communicating their thinking in a variety of contexts.

2. By June 2020, students will gain a deeper understanding of specific mathematical concepts through purposeful, timed instruction through learning sprints as based on classroom data.

3. By June 2020, students will show their understanding of the key components of all curricular strands through authentic application of knowledge.

ESD GOALS FOR 2019 - 2020:

- 1. We will continue with the beautification of the school grounds
- 2. Continue with Social Justice projects for the whole school
- 3. Continue to develop ESD learning kits for classroom use
