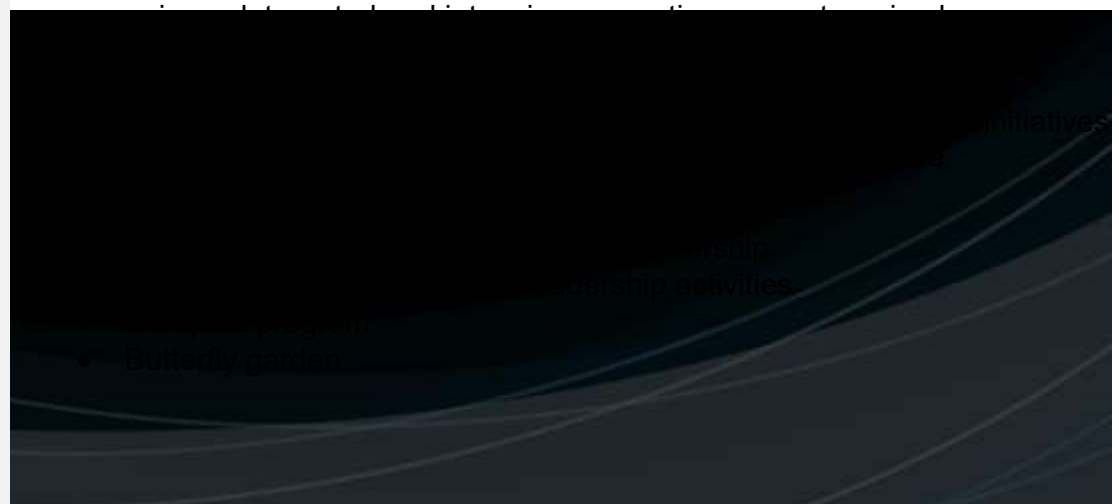
## Priorities for 2020-2021
