Champlain School is a Nursery to Grade 6 elementary school nestled in the heart of the North End of Winnipeg.

Home to 220 students, 35 staff, and many parent and community volunteers, Champlain offers engaging and quality academic programming, a Family Room open to parents and volunteers every morning daily, and many extra-curricular sports and clubs.

At Champlain, we work together to create a safe and caring learning community. With over 20 clubs running throughout the year, children have many opportunities to learn and thrive.

A daycare is attached to our school and is available to parents who have children attending. We offer a free breakfast program and daily school-wide snack.

At Champlain School, we strive to achieve our mission through the implementation of the Manitoba Provincial Curriculum. We believe in developing the capabilities of each and every one of our students for the future.

Parent and Community Involvement

Parental and community involvement and volunteers are very important at Champlain School. The Parent Council is active in supporting field trips and classroom programs. We greatly appreciate their hard work and contributions to Champlain School. The Parent Council also runs a school Lunch Program and helps with hot lunch and popcorn days.

The Parent Room continues to be an active place at Champlain School. Its purpose is to encourage parental involvement, to develop positive, on-going relationships between school, parents and community members and to provide activities and workshops that meet the needs of all parents at Champlain School.

Our Community Support Worker maintains the Parent Room and helps to run programs and activities that assist families in a variety of ways. Some examples include pre-school parties, literacy and numeracy activities, beading, sewing star blankets and leading Nutrition Bingo. Community supports and resources are provided, as needed.

Champlain School also has partnerships with community that support students. An example is the Hockey Heroes Program where students go weekly throughout the year to play hockey against other teams at Pioneer Arena.
