- Spend a few minutes every 1. evening looking over handouts your child brings home. Fill out forms to return the next dav.
- 2. Contact your child's teacher immediately if you see a problem. Working together will help your

What to do with that Report Card

Here are 5 things to do when your child's report card comes home:

- Take it seriously. A report card can't tell you 1. everything about how your child is doing. But your child's teacher spends a lot of time making sure that the report card shows you a snapshot of where your child is now. Take time to read it carefully. Talk about it with your child.
- 2. Find something to praise. Even if your child didn't do as well as you had hoped, look for something positive. Be sure to read the comments about your child's behaviour and work habits. If your child's grades weren't what you had expected, talk about what you and your child can do to improve their grades. 3.

Let your child know what you expect. Say things like, "You don't' have to be the best. But I do expect you to do your best." Remind them that effort is as important as ability.



4. Look at your child's work. You only see a report card a

few times a year. But you can look at the work your child is doing every day. There is a link between how hard students work and how much they learn. Point that out to your child. Help your child develop good work habits. A child who sets aside time everyday to read will

learn to read better. A child who practices math everyday will master math facts.

The ABCs of back-to-school safety

As families begin another school year, please remember to review safety rules with your children for walking, biking, skateboarding and bussing to school:

- Encourage them to travel with friends whenever possible;
- Develop an 'action plan' in the event of a scary situation;
- Point out Block Parent homes and other safe places along their route;
- Keep a list of your child's friends, addresses and phone numbers.

Parents and grandparents may recall the familiar Block Parent window sign, which depicts an adult lending a helping hand to a child. Since 1975, the Block

Parent goal has been to ensure 'safe homes with safe strangers'. To that end, every adult in a Block Parent home is background-checked by the police every two years, at no cost to the volunteers.

Today's Block Parent program has the participation of over 3,000 families in over 180 elementary schools throughout the city of Winnipeg. We are singles, parents, grandparents, empty-nesters, home daycare operators, retirees – any homeowner interested in the safety of their community. Our volunteers dedicate their time as the eyes and ears of our neighbourhoods.
