This is our 5th year providing a "Full Day Kindergarten" program for our community. In addition to our engaging and relevant academic programming, we offer an Arts program with Dance, Music and Drama, as well as a dynamic physical education program.

Throughout the year, we engage in ongoing discussions about student growth and teacher methodology to apply best practice based on research. We regularly review and evaluate data and school priorities asking questions like: "What is going on for our learners?", "What will have the greatest impact?", and "What do we need to learn to prepare ourselves?"



Priorities for 2019-2020

Teachers will implement a balanced math program that builds number sense, fluency and problem solving. Dreambox will be used to support instruction and assessment of math learning school wide.

ESD Goal: At the end of June 2020, each classroom will have gone through the "Roots and Shoots" 4 Step Model focusing & implementing a sustainability action project for the Elmwood Community.

PBIS Goal: By the end of June 2020, 80% each classroom will be engaged in learning and following the school expectations (Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Cooperative). By the end of June 2020, 10% less students will require an IEPLP/BIP.
