The first program in the workshop describes the characteristics and principles of a reclaiming environment. The second program describes two important needs that all young people share -- feeling accepted and competent -- and how behavioural problems result when those needs are not met. The third program describes two other critical needs and show how to teach young people the connections between independence, responsibility, and self-discipline, as well as the importance of reaching out to help others.

Program focuses on teenage depression and suicide. Explains that while the teenage years are a huge challenge and it is normal for teenagers to feel sad or stressed, when feelings of depression persist for a lengthy period and interfere with a person's ability to function, it becomes a medical/mental health disorder. Discusses the causes and signs of depression, the impact of depression on the brain, and its effect upon the individual and the people around them. Looks at the role of drugs and suicide in depression, emphasizing that suicidal individuals can be helped and that treatment is an important part of a therapeutic plan. Also considers a form of depression known as bipolar disorder or manic-depressive illness.

Program looks at alcohol, a drug belonging to a class of drugs known as depressants. Explains what alcohol is and how it is created, how the alcoholic content of beer, wine, and alcoholic beverages is determined, how alcohol impacts the human body, and what consequences a pregnant woman faces when she drinks. Considers the signs and symptoms of alcohol dependence, the development of addiction, and the treatment options available to those suffering from alcoholism. And, as well, the devastating impact of alcoholism upon users, family, and friends is revealed.

Binge drinking results in drunkenness with serious hangovers, but even greater is the danger of alcohol poisoning and death. This program examines the physiological effects of such poisoning, mixing alcohol and drugs, why kids binge drink, and why teens experience greater intoxication than adults. Actual cases of fatality and permanent injury are presented.

Shows the effects of alcohol on the liver, immune system, and gastro-intestinal system, and how binge drinking can lead to alcohol poisoning and death. Explains how alcohol impacts brain development during adolescence and permanently damages parts of the brain associated with memory. Details how a mother's drinking during pregnancy can cause Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and its impact on her child's entire life.

1 videodisc (17 minutes) + 1 teacher's resource book

With the lure of an over-the-counter jolt, kids are consuming more energy drinks than ever before and in many cases mixing them with alcohol. Through vivid interviews with teens and health experts, the video describes the many physical effects that these concoctions have including dizziness, fainting, heart palpitations, caffeine poisoning, headaches, fatigue, diminished concentration, anxiety, insomnia, shaking, nausea, and high blood pressure. Even more alarming is the trend of mixing these beverages with alcohol, thus allowing users to drink more alcohol than they normally would and putting them at a greater risk for alcohol poisoning. This program arms kids with the facts and gives a strong "no-use" message with particular emphasis on the real health risks of too much caffeine and the grave danger of combining alcohol and caffeine-spiked drinks.

1 videodisc (24 minutes) + 1 teacher's guide (5 pages)

Program looks at designer drugs often taken by teens at clubs, parties, and all night raves. Discusses their physical and mental effects upon the user, the damaging and often lethal consequences of use, and the manner in which these drugs can alter the brain's chemistry. Focuses on such drugs as Ecstasy (MDMA), ketamine, and the date rape drugs Rohypnol (roofies) and GHB (gamma-hydroxybuytrate).

Also explores the cycle of tolerance, physical dependence and addiction that abusers face, and details the physical and psychological damage that occurs as cocaine changes the brain's chemistry.

Program graphically portrays teens and young adults addicted to crystal methamphetamines, and the drug culture of Vancouver's Downtown Eastside neighbourhood. Included are a series of interviews with young addicts, and vignettes of their lives on the streets, complete with language that reflects this harsh reality. The video exposes the very real dangers of crystal meth and effectively gets its point across to the intended audience. Teachers will want to ensure adequate time after viewing for discussion. Please review before showing, coarse language, not appropriate for younger viewers.

1 videodisc (20 minutes)

Life-threatening consequences of recreational drug use and drug addiction are explored in this program. The program dispels the myth that recreational drug use is benign, and illustrates the devastating long-term effects of usage, including the trap of addiction, the consequences of overdose, and the deadly link to HIV/AIDS. Program features two teens that prefer the "high" life, and use drugs to achieve it. When they are "flipped" for a day, they suddenly find themselves confronted by the treacherous, destructive physical, mental, and social effects of use and addiction, and some of the legal repercussions.

Using the latest research, this fast-paced program explains why the teen years are a critical time for brain development - and why drug use of any kind can derail the brain's full potential when it comes to critical skills like thinking, remembering, learning and decision making. Viewers learn the anatomy of the brain and visit a state-of-the-art research lab to see clinical proof of the damage that drugs and alcohol cause. Students also learn the basic functions of the brain, the role of dopamine in the brain's reward pathway and how drugs impact that pathway, leading to addiction manic-depressive illness.

1 videodisc (23 minutes)

This video for teens dramatizes how prescription and over-the-counter drugs can be just as potent and addictive as illicit drugs like cocaine and heroin. We take a close look at the do's, don'ts, and dangers of these medicines including the potentially deadly impact of drugged driving. Students learn how abuse of OTC drugs can lead to addiction, overdose and even death. They also learn to read and heed warnings against mixing medicines together and that drugs should only be used by the person for whom they are prescribed.

Also notes the consequences of hallucinogenic abuse, focusing on such drugs as LSD, phencyclidine (PCP) and ketamine.

Discusses their impact upon the individual and society as a whole, their history, the manner of their use and how they work. Also explores the cycle of tolerance, physical dependence and addiction that abusers face, and details the factors which make it so very difficult to treat and rehabilitate them.

1 videodisc (21 minutes) + 1 teacher's guide

This program looks at a class of substances known as inhalants. Explains what inhalants are, why they are easy to obtain, and how and why people abuse them. Also reveals the dangerous impact these substances can have upon the human body and how to help, if you see what you believe are the signs and symptoms of inhalant abuse.

Program examines an extremely addictive class of drugs known as stimulants, with the more powerful stimulants providing a greater risk for misuse, abuse, and addiction. First looks at the history of stimulants and how they work on the mind and body, then considers methamphetamine use: its physical and psychological effects, the cycle of tolerance, dependence, and addiction associated with it, its impact upon the individual and society, and the life-long treatment challenges faced by drug addicts, their families, and the professionals who are attempting to help them.
