## 2019-2020 Highlights

- 29 graduates.

- The Infant Lab continued to provide support to new parents.
- Continuation of the student advisor program designed to create a supportive learning community and ease the transition to a new school.

- Career café provided an opportunity for students to learn from industry professionals.
- Focus on sustainable development through the continued development of the outdoor classroom.
- Six Family Nights connecting students, parents and community in "make and take" sessions. One evening included a Career and Opportunities Fair, exposing not only our students, but also our families to careers, resources, supports and opportunities in our community.
- · Grandparent lunches allowed the school to connect with families, and the families to connect with the school and with each other.
- Fruit was available to students in the school, supporting daily nutrition.
- The Youth in Philanthropy program had students supporting a number of organizations in Winnipeg. The Backpack Project for teens, that the students collaborated on with Snowflake Place, was a powerful learning journey in helping their community.

## **Argyle Priorities for 2019-2020**

1) To provide a comprehensive education by strengthening learning outcomes, instructional and assessment strategies for all students.

- Argyle follows a continuous progress model for instruction delivery. Students study course curriculum at an appropriate yet challenging rate of speed. Teachers identify student strengths, assess challenges and determine the next steps in learning.
- · Students learn and progress at a rate consistent with their ability, prior knowledge, interest, need and motivational patterns.
- · Coursework is chunked into 6 Blocks thoughout the year to allow students to focus on smaller groups of essential outcomes over shorter periods of time (approx. six weeks, as compared to a semester (1/2 year), or year).
- School wide integration of video production and digital media motivates and enriches classroom learning. Student productions can be viewed at: www.youtube.com/user/argylealternative

#### 2) Address the barriers to learning and improve supports for all students.

- SERT/Resource teacher to support student learning and support teachers to address academic barriers and gaps so that all students are successful.
- Through the school wide implementation of restorative practices, students were taught specific skills that emphasize communication and conflict resolution. Restorative practice is about building, maintaining and repairing relationships, and creating a safe, inclusive community of learners.
- Argyle support staff continued to offer a number of student support groups focussing on personal issues facing young men and women. In addition, students were provided opportunities to participate in cultural programming and traditional teachings to promote self-awareness and healing.
- School based initiatives and early intervention strategies for 2019/20 included breakfast program, subsidized lunch program, subsidized transportation, flexible timetabling options, Infant Lab and student driven extra-curricular opportunities.
- · Each student is assigned an "Advisor" who monitors attendance, communicates concerns and identifies action strategies.

#### 3) Communicate and collaborate with community organizations to provide learning and employment opportunities for students.

- Students participated in the Bell-MTS Mentorship program. The program pairs employees and students who engage in a variety of social and career related activities. The goal is to provide students an understanding of career opportunities available post-high school.
- Students participated in the RBC and Assiniboine credit union internship programs.
- The Youth in Philanthropy program invited Aboriginal Youth Opportunities, Winnipeg Harvest and Resource Assistant for Youth to attend our school for interviews and to perform school wide presentations as to what resources they have to offer. - ----
