Voices into Action builds on the success of the *Choose your Voice* program for middle schools that, since 2005, has been delivered to over two million students in approximately 19,000 schools in every province and territory in Canada. In 2010 *Choose Your Voice* received the Award of Excellence from the Canadian Race Relations Foundation.

Both programs are delivered by FAST-Fighting Antisemitism Together®, founded in 2005 by Tony Comper, the former CEO and President of BMO Financial, and his late wife Elizabeth. FAST is dedicated to combating all forms of intolerance and hatred, with antisemitism as a specific manifestation of it.

Immediate objectives of event:

- create a media event that will attract the attention and support of educators and school leaders with the goal that they register for and use the *Voices into Action*
- create a nucleus of school and other leaders who will actively promote the registration for and use of *Voices into Action*
- · promote human rights and social justice activism locally and globally
- promote taking action on the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission report
- promote critical thinking on difficult topics using assigned tasks, research, discussion groups, classroom debate, drama role play, written and artistic expression
- promote taking action to eliminate gender inequality both in Canada and abroad
- promote taking action as a result of what we have learned from the Holocaust and other genocides, to eliminate all forms of racism, prejudice and antisemitism

Long Range Outcome:

• Teachers in every high school will use *Voices into Action* in many subject areas to promote social justice, enhance positive classroom and school environments and hasten the elimination of racism, stereotypes and all forms of discrimination.
