Pack a mask - masks are mandatory for Grades 4 to Grades 9. Highly recommended for all students when physical distancing of 2 Metres is not possible.

BACK Important



- -Students must to enter at their assigned door
- -Our custodians have an increased cleaning and disinfecting schedule including frequent disinfecting of high touch surfaces and all classrooms will have hand sanitizer
- -Parents need an appointment to enter the building until further notice
- -"School Street" initiative starting on September 8th - email to follow
- -No cell phones in class
- -Number of students in washrooms will be limited to accommodate physical distancing
- -Water fountains will not be in use
- -Limited use of lockers only for Junior High
- -There will be **no school safety patrols** to begin the school year but we will update parents as that changes and about our new "Stop, Drop, & Go" zone being launched

Students will stay to the right (following the arrows on the floor) and will stay 6 feet apart while traveling in the school.




School Map

Recess & Lunch

Isaac Brock School will have staggered recess times.

Each Classroom will be assigned an outdoor area to play during recess time. All cohorts will have their own recess equipment.

The play structure will not be sanitized between uses. Students will wash their hands before and after recess.

Students who are registered with Valour Community Club for lunch program or who are in the Cree or Ojibwe Bilingual program will be supervised and eat lunch in their classroom



Appointments and Early Pickups

- 2. When you arrive call the office and a staff member will ensure a safe meet up outside of the school.

Late Arrivals

If your child is late, they will need to use the front doors. There will be an adult at the front door in the morning until 9:30 and in after lunch until 1:15. If your child is later than 9:30 or 1:15, please call the school (204-772-9527)when your child arrives so that an adult may meet them at the front door for screening and hand sanitizing procedures.

What happens if a child becomes ill at school?

 If a child develops symptoms at school they must go home immediately.



- The child will be given a mask and will be isolated in a separate room while being monitored by a staff member.
- Parents/guardians will be called to pick their child immediately.
- Parents/guardians need to phone the school when they arrive and a staff member will walk the child out to meet them.
