Administrator's Message

All parents of children attending ÉSKS can be members of the Parent Advisory Council. Your involvement in PAC would be very welcome. The next meeting is Tuesday, November 6th at 6:30 pm in the school's library.

The initial phase of our elementary assessment is complete and teachers are learning more about their students in order to plan for each of them. The Provincial Report Card for Grades 1 - 8 that will be going home on Wednesday, November 14th, will provide information on your child's strengths and what next steps are needed as they progress toward the provincial outcomes. This information will be further discussed during our **Tri-Conferences (Parent-Child-Teacher) on Thursday, November 15th from 3:45 to 8:00 pm and Friday, November 16th from 9:00 to 11:45 am.**

We will be having our Remembrance Day assembly on Friday, November 9th. The Nursery - 6 assembly will take place at 9:45 am and the Grade 7 - 8 assembly will be at 11:00 am. We encourage Sparks, Brownies, Girl Guides, Cubs, Beavers, Scouts and Cadets to wear their uniforms if they wish. Parents are welcome to join us for the assembly.

Just a few friendly reminders:

- We ask that if you have any changes to your address, home, work, or cell phone numbers as well as emergency contact numbers that you contact the school. Our updated files will ensure that should there be an emergency regarding your child, we will be able to contact you immediately.
- If you are picking your child up from school early, please come to the school office so that we can call your child down to the office to meet you. This helps with keeping classroom interruptions to a minimum and our school safety plan to have all visitors report to the office and students signed out by an adult.



- If your child takes the bus home from school, please let the office know prior to 3:00 pm if your child is being picked up or if leaving early for an appointment so that our bus monitors are not looking for students who are not in their bus lines when it is time to load the buses.
- The month of November tends to become much cooler quickly. Please make sure that your child is dressed appropriately All children are expected to go out for recess during the morning and the afternoon as well as 30 minutes during the lunch hour.
- Every day, after school, children come to the office to call home. Students want to know who is picking them up or ask if they can go to a friend's house. These arrangements need to be made at home, not at 3:30. Please ensure your children understand how they are getting home before they leave for school in the morning



Cold Weather Reminders

Students Arrival At School

When the cold weather has truly arrived, we remind parents, guardians and students that they should arrive at school **NO EARLIER** than 8:50 am and 12:35 pm.

Students arriving before the above times will have to wait outside in the cold weather.

Indoor Recess Policy

During the winter months, the wind chill is checked before morning recess, lunch time and afternoon recess.

Students are expected to dress appropriately for the weather at all times. As per WSD policy, students will be kept indoors only on inclement days when the wind chill reaches -28° Celsius. When the wind chill is between -25° to -27° , students may go out for a shortened 10 minute recess.



At times, parents and guardians have requested by a note to the classroom teacher or a phone call to the school, to have their child remain indoors at recess time. It is our school's belief that if a students is too sick to go outdoors at recess, then he or she is too sick to be at school.

We would ask parents and guardians to send children to school only when they are well enough to participate in all activities, including recess.

Emergency School Closing

In the event of an emergency school closing, our first concern is the safety of our students. The decision to close the school is made by the Chief Superintendent and media outlets will be contacted to ask that they broadcast and/or post school cancellation information.

Parents and guardians should instruct their children where they are to go in the case of an emergency closure. (Either home if a parent/guardian is available or to an alternate address the parents have arranged.) Children need to be reminded of this procedure regularly.

In case our school needs to be evacuated on short notice, an alternate shelter is required. Tyndall Park School will serve as our alternate shelter. The school is located at 2221 King Edward Street and their phone number is 204-633-0065.

It is our sincere hope that a threatening emergency will never occur. However, instructing your children as to your expectations will assist in ensuring their health and safety under emergency conditions.

Grade 5/6 Music: We have been playing a lot of recorder and learning new songs and new tones. We have even been adding some percussion to our songs once we get good at them. Coming up soon, students will have a chance to flex their recorder skills as we start Recorder Karate. Students will have a chance to earn their belts as they improve their music-reading skills and perform progressively more challenging pieces while improving things like their breath control, articulation, and tone.

Grade 7 Band: Four of our Grade 7 classes have wrapped up their first month in band and have made the switch to art, and vice-versa. We have just finished our band instruments testing and students have chosen their instruments for the next month. We will be learning all the basics of being in band, how to put the instruments together, how to hold them, and how to make a sound. We will work on learning our first 5 notes between now and the end of the month, at which point students will declare for art or band for the rest of the year. It's always an exciting time when students get to try instruments for the first time!

Grade 8 Band: We have spent a lot of time reviewing fundamentals of our instruments and playing lots of tunes from our method books. Several students have been learning new instruments and are doing a fantastic job making the sound of the band better. We will be introducing more challenging pieces of music and exercises to help students become more familiar with their instruments and to sharpen their skills.

Grade 7/8 Choir: It's been a fun start to the year! We have been singing a lot of round songs and tunes in canon to help develop our ability to sing in harmony. We have also introduced several stretches and vocal warm-ups to help us sing our best. We have a couple of songs that have even challenged us rhythmically. We are starting to learn the song "Roar" by Katy Perry, which we will perform later in the year.

Mitts: If you have extra mitts at your house, please bring them to Room 148.


Batteries: USED batteries. Don't throw them out, bring them to our recycling box, all year round.
