General Wolfe School Welcoming Our Students Back September 2020

We are looking forward to welcoming all of our returning students as well as those new to our school to in-class learning! This is certainly not a typical start of the school year, but we would like to assure our students, parents and school community that we have been diligently planning for a safe return to school, by strictly adhering to Public Health orders and with direction from Manitoba Education and the Winnipeg School Division. To this end we would like to share with you some of the routines, protocols and resources in place at General Wolfe School to ensure the physical and mental safety of all students, staff and community. This plan will evolve with last minute changes, as new information becomes available and in response to current Public Health orders. We will continue to provide you with these updates as needed.

On July 30th the province released an update based on Public Health advice which stated that all students would be returning to in-class learning this September. *The Welcoming Our Students Back: Restoring Safe Schools* document provides guidelines for K-12 schools, acknowledging that it looks different in each setting based on the context of each school. The guidelines state that all students in Grades K-8 will attend school every day, and high school students will attend to the greatest extent possible. After careful planning, we have decided that all of our students, grade 7,8 and 9 will attend full time.

This plan provides guidance for the three levels of response planning.

Level 1- In-class Learning- Grade 7-9 students will be in-class every day.

Level 2 – **Blended** Learning – grade 7-9 students will participate in teacher-led remote learning, with limited use of school facilities.

Level 3 – Remote Learning (with exceptions) – Remote learning in place for all students with limited use of school facilities.

Class lists will be posted on the school windows on Friday, Sept. 4th. The first day of classes will be September 8th, Day 4. All students are to arrive at school at 8:45 and line-up at the designated doors. Please refer to the map below:

Students will be given 2 reusable non-medical masks to use at school.

Masks are required in all indoor spaces where physical distancing of 2 meters cannot be maintained.

Students will be assigned an entry/exit doorway where they will line up, ensuring social distancing. (Please see attachment B)

Students will be screened at the doorway by school staff and then escorted to their classroom.

Students will wear their masks while lining up and when moving throughout the school.

Students will remain in their homeroom classrooms, subject teachers will move to the classrooms.

Students will not be assigned a locker. We are requesting all students bring a box or tote to store their school supplies in.

The box/tote will be kept under their desk.

Water fountains will not be accessible. Students are asked to bring a water bottle, which can be filled at our no-touch fill station.

Physical distancing of 1 meter will occur in homeroom cohorts.

Physical distancing of 2 meters in hallways and non-cohort groups.

Students will move to their elective/optional classes within their cohorts.

Students will remain in their cohort groups during school hours.

Unidirectional flow throughout the building.

Students will transition in single lines when moving from class to class.

Classroom entry/exit in single lines adhering to social distancing protocols.

Staff will provide supervision during the lunch hour.

Hand washing/sanitizing when entering school and throughout the day.

Attachment B – Masks

Masks are mandatory for all students 4-12 when physical distancing of 2 meters cannot be maintained and on school busses. Masks will be worn when lining up to enter the school, upon dismissal and when moving throughout the school building.

All students will be given 2 reusable masks to be worn at school.

To be effective, masks must be worn properly.

You must do the following:

Wash your hands immediately before putting the mask on and immediately after taking the mask off.

Practice good hand hygiene while wearing the mask.

Ensure your mask fits well and covers your nose, mouth and chin.


Do not share your mask with others.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Due to the COVID19 Pandemic, the structure of the General Wolfe School Lunch Program for this upcoming school year will be different to adhere to the Manitoba Public Health Protocols. It is essential we follow the guidelines from the Manitoba Public Health to keep our staff and students safe. Our lunch program will be limited to those students who live a long distance away from school or those who have a valid reason to attend the lunch program. You can register your child(ren) at no cost by way of email (generalwolfe@wsd1.org) or phone (204)-786-7427 before the school starts. The Lunch Program structure and expectations are below.

Lunch Program:

- Students will stay in their homerooms to eat their lunch from 11:45-12:40
- Students will follow social distancing protocols at all times
- Students must bring their own lunches that do not require heating as microwaves will not be available
- Students can purchase food from the "Nook" menu on a weekly basis from their homeroom teacher (lunches will be made and delivered by staff)
 - o \$3 per day or \$15 per week
 - You can pay by cash or cheque (made to General Wolfe School) on a weekly basis every Thursday


Expectations:
