The days are getting shorter and the temperature is cooling down, which means that fall is officially upon us! We want to thank all of our staff members and families for helping our students readjust to school routines and for starting the school year off on such a positive note.

Thank you to everyone who attended the Lansdowne Parent Council BBQ and Meet the Teacher evening on September 6th, your continued support and involvement are essential in maintaining a successful partnership in your child(ren)'s education. We would like to take this opportunity to remind you to please establish a routine with your child that includes checking their backpack and/or agenda everyday, as important information is often sent home and communicated in this manner.

To our families who have been experiencing issues with the bus service, we want to sincerely apologize for any inconvenience you may have been caused. Should you continue experiencing late pick-ups, drop offs or bus cancellations, please call WSD Transportation at 204-586-8800 or 204-789-0452. It is also imperative that you check your email daily for bussing updates/messages.

A reminder that the parking lot closest to the school and play structure is reserved for staff only. Staff pay monthly fees to park in this lot and we are asking for your cooperation in not dropping off or picking up your child(ren) from this parking lot during the day. Another reminder that there is no parking or stopping in front of École Lansdowne on Wiginton Street during the school year: violators risk receiving a photo radar ticket. We encourage families to use the Northgate parking lot to drop off and pick up your child(ren) to reduce excess traffic in this area. We have patrols and crossing guards stationed to help students cross the street safely before and after school: parking and walking with your child is the safest way to enter and exit the building.

On behalf of the L.P.C. we would like to thank families for their participation in our chocolate fundraiser, which is still ongoing. We ask that all funds raised and any leftover chocolates be returned to the office no later than Friday, October 7th. All money raised by the L.P.C. and other school-run fundraisers will go towards enhancing educational opportunities for all of our students. Without your support, this additional programming and enrichment would not be possible!

Our Lansdowne Athletics programming is already in full swing! The cross-country team has been practicing and racing weekly, and both volleyball and soccer programs are up and running. ### WHAT IS LUNCH PROGRAM?

The Lunch Program is a **non-profit small business** that is administered by the Lansdowne Parent Council. The L.P.C. is a **volunteer group of parents** who have been given the mandate by the Winnipeg School Division to oversee the Lunch Program. As such, L.P.C. employs a Lunch Program Coordinator and Supervisors. L.P.C. pays E.I., W.C.B., C.R.A. taxes, pension, and vacation pay. Some parent councils within the school division have their lunch programs administered by outside agencies. This allows those parent councils to focus on council work vs. running a business with all the associated responsibilities.

All students staying at school at lunch must be registered.

#### WHAT MAKES ÉCOLE LANSDOWNE'S LUNCH PROGRAM DIFFERENT?

Many lunch programs cap registration to a specific number of children - some on a first-come, first-served basis and some strictly on need (only those who can prove this need are permitted to enroll, for example both parents work and no one is able to pick up their child). No other school in the W.S.D. has a Lunch Program with no registration cap and a coordinator onsite 6 hours per day, 5 days per week.

The École Lansdowne Lunch Program is the **cheapest within the W.S.D.** with no rate increase in over 4 years. The monthly cost is \$22 per student (just \$1.10 per day!), and less if there are more than 2 students per family. The **cost per day is \$1.10 per student**, less if there are more than 2 students per family. Daily fresh milk can also be added at a monthly cost of just \$6.

### LUNCH PROGRAM ADJUSTMENTS:

**Please be advised that microwaves will not be available**. Milk is to be consumed within the lunch hour. Please do not bring milk home that has been sitting in lunch kits. As well, milk is not to be shared by students.



**All payments are due on the 20th** of the preceding month (this aligns with the Child Tax Benefit payment).

**Lunch Program fees cover program costs only.** They do not cover food, snacks, or drinks from the canteen. These must be purchased separately.

A \$5.00 late fee will be applied at the end of the first week of non-payment and a flat \$10.00 fee will be applied after that. Late fees must be paid with the monthly fees.
