Principal's Message

There is so much happening at École Luxton School.

We were excited to gather all together in the gym for our assembly on Respect. We learned that respect is about giving from the heart, without expecting a return. This is the Sacred Teaching of the Bison. We also learned that our words can come out quickly, like toothpaste out of a tube, but that it's harder to take our words back, just like we can't really put the toothpaste back in the tube.

We practiced our evacuation drill, and all students did a great job with understanding the importance of moving quickly and quietly, and were wonderful as we waited in the community centre for more instructions. Everyone really did a wonderful job!

We will be keeping our main front doors locked again, due to some recent safety concerns. We will be trying out a doorbell in order to gain access, should your child be late for school, if you need to collect a child, or need to drop something off. As before, you can also always call to be let in. Our students' safety is a top concern, and we want to be better able to continue to monitor who is entering the building.

There are clubs in progress at lunch time, projects and learning abound in the classrooms – take a look through the pages of this newsletter for some of what's been happening in classes.

Looking ahead to the next month, we will be holding a Remembrance Day ceremony on Thursday, November 10th, at 10:30 AM in the gym. You are welcome to attend if you would like to do so.

We will be holding our parent/teacher conferences on Thursday, November 17th, after school, and the morning of Friday, November 18th. As we did last year, we will be sending out a link for the Conference Manager, where you can book an appointment online. If you can't access, you can always call the office for help to set up an appointment.

















News from Salle 8 - Room 8





















Counsellor's Corner
