

Date:January 25, 2023Subject:Grade 9-12 Registration Procedures and Course Options – Semester Two – 2022/23

<u>All students</u> who would benefit from taking courses in a virtual setting are eligible to register. Virtual School uses Google Classroom as the learning platform. **Medical notes are** <u>not</u> required. Students register and take all their courses through the Virtual School, and the Virtual School becomes their home school. **Students who are unable to attend in-person classes** regardless of the reason are welcome. Classes are taught synchronously, or asynchronously when timetable conflicts exist.

## **REGISTERING FOR VIRTUAL SCHOOL/COURSES:**

Non-resident students of the Winnipeg School Division are welcome to apply. Please contact the school directly, as School of Choice guidelines apply as per the <u>Winnipeg School Division Policy – JEC – School Admissions/School of Choice</u>. Acceptance is based on numerous factors including program and grade request, space availability, and class size.

Non-resident students must fill out a <u>Non-Resident Student Application Form</u> **AND** a <u>Student Application for Registration</u> <u>Form</u>.

## COURSE DELIVERY & TEACHER SUPPORT

Courses are delivered synchronously and asynchronously. **Students are expected to attend live classes but may view the lessons and coursework asynchronously if there is a conflict with their virtual or home school timetable.** Virtual School teachers record and post their lessons daily, after the live lesson has been completed. Course work (videos, assigned readings, practice work, assignments) is organized with due dates.

Students may contact their teacher for any reason, including to schedule a meeting, either by email, class messaging, during scheduled classes, or in-person. Likewise, parents/guardians, counsellors/administration, and support staff of home school students may also contact teachers.
