SCHOOL OPENING TIMES

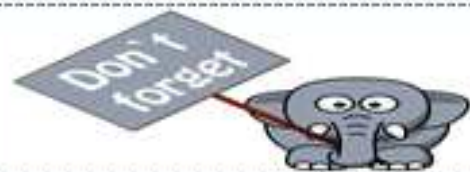

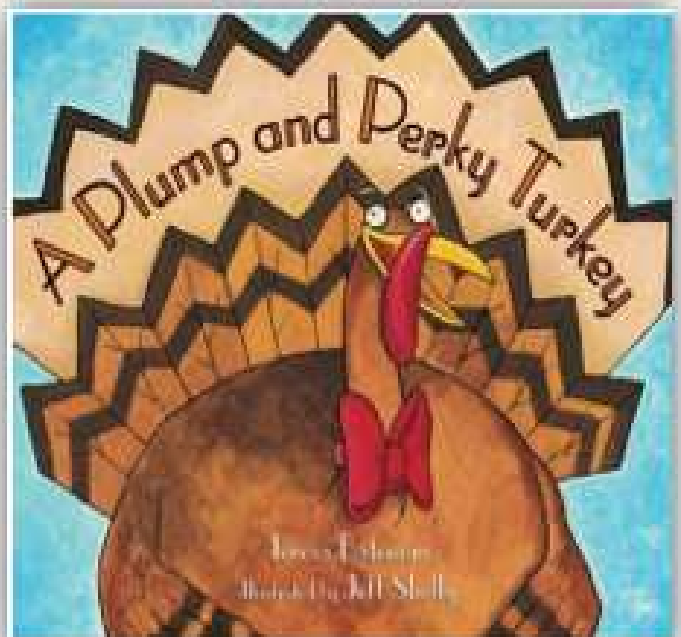
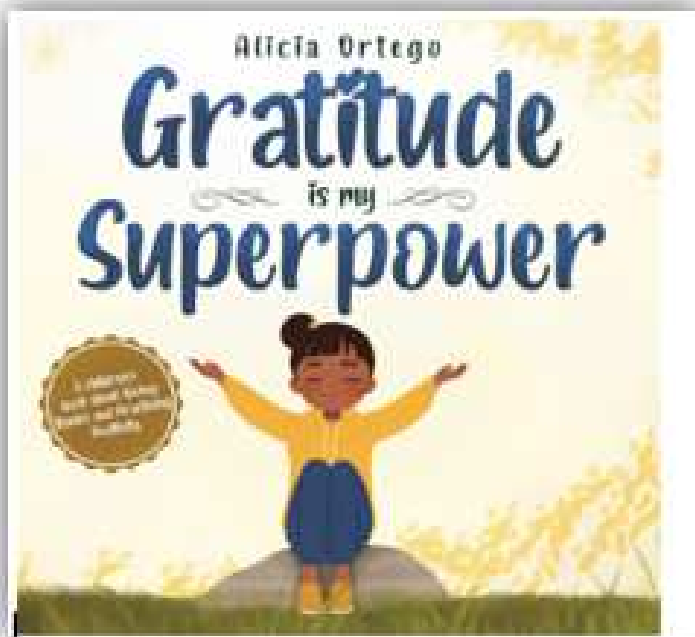
Sorry, No Drop Ins

We ask parents to please go over the lunchroom rules with your children on a regular basis: our policy follows School Division guidelines. When a child mis-behaves the first time, a verbal warning will be given. The second time a written letter will be sent home. Within this letter it will state that your child will be removed if the behaviour continues. If the child's behaviour does not improve he/she will be removed from the Lunch Program. Then you will need to make alternate arrangements for your child. In the event of a serious incident—your child **WILL BE** removed immediately without warning.

We would like to encourage you not to send soda pop or noodles. Nut and seafood allergies among children are becoming increasingly common: therefore we have a **NO NUTS & SEAFOOD** policy. We have many other allergies as well, children are not allowed to share or exchange their snacks or lunches.

Then, one day the father let her go to school, but little does she know the dark truth about the school...

This year in math we have been doing ABC math books (where we do the letters of the alphabet to make big and small numbers) and math games (such as wraps and countdown). Our math booklets practice big numbers like 1 trillion (1 000 000 000 000) or small precise decimal numbers (like 1.45).

In school every morning we do weather and news. We record the current temperature, the high, and the low. We look at the news and write about things like Queen Elizabeth's death and cats crashing into each other photo contest.

In Social Studies we have been learning about First Nation Communities in Manitoba (where we research about one community). Before that we learned about land acknowledgement (where we presented pictures or slideshows about Treaty 1).
