

Adventures with Room 8 and Mr. Storey


What did you say?

As we continue our journey in writing, the students of Room 8 are learning a whole new way of adding voice to their writing. Since September we have been working on story telling. You may have seen examples of their writing on our classroom bulletin board when you came for parent teacher meetings. We have many talented writers in our room.

One of the lessons we have been working on since the beginning is that our stories should be exciting, interesting, and captivating. We want the reader to be there with us. We want the reader to want more when they finish reading the story. We want the reader to be interested and ask questions about our stories.

A new way of doing this is to add direct quotes from the characters in the story. We aren't just writing that a character said something. We are writing exactly what they said and how they said it. We won't just write that BB saw his friend and said hi. We'll write, "Hey, friend! How are you?" shouted BB.

As we move forward with this addition of dialogue to our stories, we hope that we can continue to write stories that engage our readers even more. I look forward to being able to share with you our class's writing using dialogue in the future.


We are now working on character development. I am looking forward to all the interesting characters that are being created!

We 'show' our reader what our character struggles with through dialogue, actions, and inner thoughts rather than by simply 'telling' our reader. We can't wait to share our masterpieces with our families and with the students of Room 15 during our writing celebration on December 6th!

Room 14 continues to collectively solve problems together within random groupings to learn new concepts in mathematics. We have begun to learn multiplication and students have shown each other the many ways to find a solution. Learning math through problem-solving has proven to be a great way for us to harness all our energy and keep us engaged. Way to go boys and girls for sticking with it even when the word problem is a little hard and helping each other learn.

Students in Room 14 not only like to solve problems together they also like to build together. Students are beginning to understand it is important to create a strong base to support a free-standing structure and are assembling sturdier constructions for our STEM designs. 
When we are done being authors, mathematicians, and engineers it's time to play! Make sure to dress warm so you can enjoy the snow at recess time boys and girls.
