I hope everyone had a fun yet relaxing holiday break. It was nice meeting with family and friends and setting small new years resolutions for 2023.

I am happy to announce Room 11's new classroom teacher, Ms. Pilar Anciro. She will be starting her position in January until the end of June. I have met with Ms. Anciro regarding classroom routines and expectations of students continuing to be a Weston Hawk, which is being safe, being respectful, and being responsible.

Although I will not be Room 11's regular teacher, fortunately I will still be in the building and supporting room 11 and other primary and intermediate classrooms in the area of Mathematics. I will be working collectively with classroom teachers on students next steps in learning and reaching their learning goals.

Reflecting back in 2022, the students in room 11 have participated in many learning adventures. First, it was fantastic that we had an all day field trip to Fort Whyte in September. The students were able to learn about sustainable development and showing an appreciation for nature by going on a 2 hour nature hike.

Second, we also had many enriching learning conversations in solving a variety of multiplication math problems.

Students were able to practice sharing a toolbox of strategies when solving a math problem. Whether that being pictorially (the use of pictures), symbolically (written as an equation), concretely (the use of base ten blocks), and orally (presenting and recording their reflections with their peers).

Third, the students were able to learn how to become more responsible readers. Students practiced how to get to know the books text not just by decoding but by making predictions, asking purposeful questions, making clarifications, and summarizing with the support of the divisional Literacy Support Teacher, Adrienne. Students will continue these strategies in their guided reading groups for the remainder of the school year.

I could honestly go on and on commenting how amazing 2022 was. I am looking forward to new and exciting teaching and student learning explorations in 2023!

Room 14 - Ms. Massey


Room 14 wrapped up their unit on narrative writing with a celebration on December 6th. We read our stories to students from room 15 from the author's chair. We kept our audience engaged with descriptive details and juicy words. It was awesome to see all the proud smiles after students read the writing, they'd worked so hard on. Way to go boys and girls!

Our classroom is full of kinesthetic learners this year who love to design and build, so we continue to make our learning day fun with STEM challenges. Students get to collaborate and problem-solve. Look at these towers! Students had twenty minutes to build the tallest tower they could using 50 index cards with their partner. It's awesome to see you so engaged Room 14. Good work!

Students have moved into their study of fractions in mathematics. We are learning that a fraction is a part of a whole and the many ways we can represent a fraction. It would be great if families could support our learning by taking any opportunities that come up to notice fractions in our daily lives. How many dimes are in half of a dollar? How many slices are in a quarter of our pizza? Is there a way to use our 1/3 cup to put a cup of flour in our recipe? How many minutes are in 3/4's of an hour? What do you think a third of the distance to the park is? Noticing the real-world connections of fractions will deepen our understanding and help us know why we are learning it.








Music and Integrated Arts -Ms. Neufeld
