On Friday, September 16th, Room 8 did our first exploration project. We will do many more of these throughout the year. Learning is an adventure, and I believe learning should be just as much about building and designing as it is about writing and counting numbers. For our first exploration project, the students were provided with a bucket of plastic straws and connectors. Their job was to figure out how to build walls that could stand on their own. These walls needed to be connected in a way that the teacher could place a chair inside and sit inside. The students knew immediately that this was a group project that involved teamwork, and they were very successful at this. Even as parts fell apart, kids swooped in and reconnected pieces to make the walls stronger. There was an attempt to build a roof, but we're not at that stage yet! That might take a bit of teaching still!

Throughout the year the students will get to experience many more exploration days. They will learn how to build mazes using blocks, Lego creations, symmetrical designs with pattern blocks, and much much more. As I get SeeSaw up and running, you parents will also get to experience these creations.

Happy October Everyone!

We had a fantastic start to the beginning of the school year! The class has been demonstrating what it means to be a Weston Hawk by being respectful, being safe, and being responsible which relates to our unit in Social Studies called, Canadian Citizenship.

The students attended a field trip to Fort Whyte. They took part in a twohour nature hike learning about sustainable development and Indigenous plants and their benefits to all living things. The students discovered many bison, Canadian Geese, and ponds and got to learn about the types of beaks birds have which influences their food choices and adapting to the environment around them. The class also got to explore inside a sod house, which was a warm shelter in the winter, yet cool in the summer for the families that pioneered on the Canadian prairies. Lastly, the students participated in critter dipping. They got to see what types of living organisms can be found throughout the marsh waters.

September has been a jam-packed month full of excitement, getting to know one another and hands-on learning in Room 14!

We had a blast on our field Trip to Fort Whyte Alive. Students saw first-hand how a variety of plants and animals meet their needs in their habitats. We also visited a teepee and learned about its construction and saw a variety of animals including frogs, a muskrat, bison, ducks, geese and fish. The weather was wonderful for a memorable day of learning and exploration.

In mathematics we are learning about the value of each digit in a numeral up to 1, 000, 000. by representing numbers in multiple ways using a variety of manipulatives.

In social studies we are learning the geography of Canada and pointing out all the places we have visited on a map. We are learning about the awesome landforms Canada has too, such as mountains, coastlines and valleys.

We are picking up right where we left off with our writing using our strategies to think of personal stories and techniques like adding dialogue and onomatopoeia (sound words) to make our writing interesting.

Students have also been visiting the Makerspace room and working together on design and building projects with Ms. Eppert!

Hi Room 15 Families,

I am excited to welcome your child in room 15. In the first week of the school year, we had a fun time to get to know each other when doing the Scavenger Hunt to find friends that have the same favourite food, color, hobbies, or games. We also wrote a poem "All about me" and created a personal flag to introduce about ourselves. In math, we reviewed how to represent numbers up to one million by starting with the number of the day booklets. We learned about the diversity of living things in science, and we know that the two big main groups of animal classification are vertebrates and invertebrates. We have begun to explore Canada, its history and the building of our country. We created our classroom treaty which states the rights and responsibilities of the teacher and the students in the classroom. In addition, we recognize the zones of regulations that help us realize the feelings or emotions that we have and we suggest the strategies that we can or should do to help us stay calm. The temperature is getting lower, and it rains more often. Therefore, remind your child to dress according to the weather.

Music and Integrated Arts -Ms. Neufeld

I have been teaching at Weston school for a number of years and have appreciated all the students and musical experiences that have come through our doors. My specialty and passion is singing, and nothing makes me feel as good as hearing students join together in song. If you had asked me when I was a child where music would have taken me, I would not have dreamed of the opportunities I have had because I sing. I try to share those experiences and that sense of "anything is possible" with my classes and remind them that they never know where what they learn here may take them.

Focus: The focus in the music program is on integration of the Arts- drama, movement, and occasionally art- into music class. Each of the Arts components offer students different ways to improve both academic and social/emotional skills:

First term: The focus and reporting in the first term is on music, with students learning and being assessed on music reading, instrument playing and creative skills. Music enhances students' learning in mathematics, language arts, social studies, and even science. Studies have also shown that students who are part of a music program have better social skills. Singing, especially, is well known to contribute to students feeling of inclusivity and positivity.

Second term: While we continue to work with music, assessment and reporting shifts to the drama curriculum. Drama creates a sense of community in the classroom and encourages students to take risks in exploring ideas and emotions. This year, the focus in drama will be on public speaking and vocal expression.

Third term: This term, we will connect music with dance. Dance offers students a way to develop coordination, improve their fitness level, express themselves using their bodies, and make connections with both music and drama. The emphasis will be on dance language and creativity and individual expression.

Special Opportunities:

Choir: Grade 4-6 choir will be starting late September. This will be a lunch hour club that will meet once a cycle and prepare and sing songs for assemblies and concerts. The only requirement is a love to sing! Depending on the size of the group, Grade 3 students in Rooms 10/11 may be included.

Recorder Club: This will be open to students in Grades 4-6 who enjoy recorder and want more opportunities to grow and play as an ensemble, starting mid to late October and running til Winter break.

Ukulele Club: Open to students in Grades 4-6 who want to advance their playing skills, starting mid-February and running til Spring Break.

In music, students are expected to be: Respectful, Responsible, and Safe
