Arrival at School

Students in rooms 7, ,10, 11, 14 & 15 will enter through the doors located at the big field. Students in rooms 5, 6 & 8 will enter through the doors located at the back of the school by the small play structure. Supervision at these doors will begin at 8:45 am and 12:55 pm.

Nursery and Kindergarten students need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian and will enter through the main doors located on Logan. They should arrive at 8:50 a.m. and 12:55 p.m.

Dismissal from School

Students in Rooms 7, 10 & 11 will be dismissed at the doors located at Logan and Quelch. Students in rooms 14 & 15 will be dismissed at the doors located on Alexander and Quelch. Students in rooms 5, 6 and 8 will be dismissed at the doors located at the back of the school by the small play structure. Students in rooms 5, 6 and 8 must be picked up by someone who is listed as an authorized pick up person for that child.



Crossing Guards

Weston School has an Adult Crossing Guard assist student crossing at Logan Ave and Quelsh at the following times:

8:45 - 9:00 a.m.

11:55 - 12:10 p.m.

12:45 - 1:00 p.m.

3:30 - 3:45 p.m.

Student patrols assist at Quelsh Ave and Alexander Ave (15 minutes before and after dismissals). Times are adjusted according to weather conditions.

Safe Arrival Program



Child safety is the main purpose for the SafeArrival Program. If a student has not arrived at school for the day and the SafeArrival program has not received a report explaining that the child will be away, SafeArrival calls will be made to the current listed as lives with contacts in our student information system. Please make sure you have updated your most current phone number and email address.

With Safe Arrival, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at https://go.schoolmessenger.ca). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time.



NEW PROGRAM WALKING SCHOOL BUS

We heard you Weston parents! We are beginning a new program this year called the Walking School Bus.

If you have students grades 2-6 who need some extra supervision on their walk to school...sign up for the WALKING SCHOOL BUS.

Staff will be picking up student from 3 different stops:

- Blake and Smart St. 8:40 am
- Alexander and Worth 8:45 am
- Alexander and Cecil 8:50 am

Student must be at the designated stops on time, staff will not wait for late students.

Breakfast Program

The Breakfast Program is available to any Weston student and operates each morning. Students are provided with a nutritious meal.

Breakfast will be served directly to students in classrooms at 8:55 am until approximately 9:15 am.

Breakfast items will be served directly to students by means of individually wrapped items and will be enjoyed at their desks in classrooms.

Lunch Program News

Weston School Lunch Program is currently at full capacity. To be placed on our wait list, you must fill out an application. Forms are available in the office. Parents/guardians must be either working or attending school for their child to qualify for the program. Otherwise, students are expected to go home for lunch.

Fees for Lunch Program are: \$35/month for first student \$15/month for each additional student from the same household.

A Message from Public Health

For those of you who do not know me, I am Laura. I am your Public Health Nurse and I work mainly in the Weston community. My office is located at 785 Keewatin Street at Access Nor'West. Some of you may know me as the nurse who does immunizations at the school. I have many other roles in the community including following new moms who are discharged from the hospital with their babies. I can provide you information on any community resources as well. A few things I had wanted to tell you about are:



- There is a walk-in-clinic at 785 Keewatin Street. Hours are Monday through Friday 12:00pm-7:30pm, Saturdays & Sundays 9:00am-4:30pm
- If you are a parent with children under 5 years, please check out Bright Start, any Thursday at the Weston Community Center, 1625 Logan Ave, from 09:30-am-11:30am. There is free breakfast every week, a nurse practitioner and more!
- I will doing the grade 6 immunizations at Weston School on October 4, 2022 in the morning, please watch for information regarding the consent forms from the school. If you have any questions, please call me @ 2046120963.

As the school year gets underway, if there you have any questions regarding head lice, please feel free to call me! Head lice is frustrating. It is spread from person to person. I can go over treatment options with you and answer any questions.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

The Truth and Reconciliation Commission ran from 2008 to 2015 and provided those directly or indirectly affected by the legacy of the residential schools policy with an opportunity to share their stories and experiences. The Commission released its final report detailing 94 calls to action. The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation is a direct response to Call to Action 80, which called for a federal statutory day of commemoration.

There were 140 federally run residential schools in Canada that operated between 1831 and 1998. The last school closed less than 25 years ago. Survivors advocated for recognition and reparations and demanded accountability for the intergenerational impacts of harms caused.

Wear Orange

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30. In schools we will observe this day on September 29th.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On September 29 & 30, we encourage everyone to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.
