Thank you for all your support over the last school year!



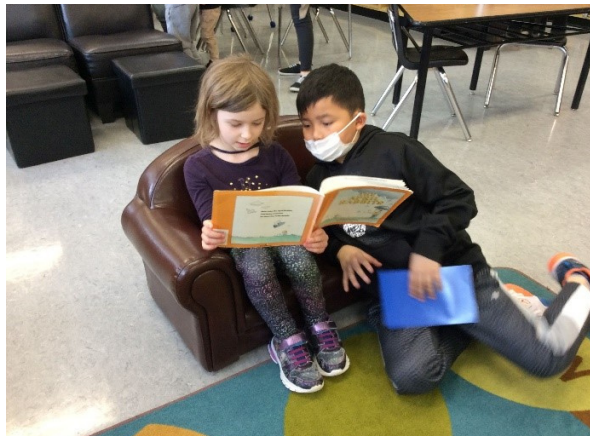

Well, here we are in our last month of school! It is hard to believe how fast the year went by! Our month of May was a busy place in the Nursery/Kindergarten room. Our dramatic play area turned into a Flower Shop which the students had so much fun exploring and playing at using many language and numeracy concepts. We also completed an author study on Mr. Eric Carle who famously wrote "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". We looked at and discussed Mr. Carle's unique way he created his pictures in his books. The students then created their own Flower Art based on this type of artwork. The results were a very beautiful looking flower garden! (pictures posted on Seesaw).

We also began our "Literacy Leaders" program which has the N/K students paired with Grade 3/4 students. The Grade 3/4's read to the N/K students and ask them questions about the story. This is a wonderful opportunity for our older students to be peer leaders and our younger students to hear and engage with stories from other students in the school.



In June we will be exploring and learning about Dinosaurs! This is such a fun and exciting unit for the students! There will be many opportunities for the students to explore with numeracy and literacy activities focused around Dinosaurs.

REGISTRATION FOR 2022-2023

WE ARE NOW ACCEPTING REGISTRATIONS FOR CHILDREN WHO WILL BE ATTENDING NURSERY OR KINDERGARTEN NEXT YEAR.

TO ATTEND THE NURSERY PROGRAM CHILDREN MUST BE FOUR YEARS OF AGE BY DECEMBER 31, 2022 (BORN IN 2018). TO ATTEND KINDERGARTEN, CHILDREN MUST BE FIVE YEARS OLD BY DECEMBER 31, 2022 (BORN IN 2017). THE NURSERY PROGRAM IS FREE FOR CHILDREN WHO LIVE IN THE WINNIPEG SCHOOL DIVISION CATCHMENT. IF YOU LIVE OUT OF AREA, THE COST IS \$5,000 FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR.

THE NURSERY/KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM RUNS FROM 9:00—11:30 AM OR 1:00-3:30 MONDAY TO FRIDAY.

IF YOU HAVE A CHILD WHO WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR EITHER PROGRAM, PLEASE REGISTER THEM AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

IF YOUR CHILD IS CURRENTLY ATTENDING NURSERY AT CLIFTON SCHOOL, REGISTRATION FOR KINDERGARTEN WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY DONE.

***DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO REGISTER YOUR CHILD ARE: MEDICAL CARD, BIRTH CERTIFICATE (OR TREATY CARD) AND PROOF OF RESIDENCY (PROPERTY TAX BILL, LEASE AGREEMENT, CHILD TAX STATEMENT OR A UTILITY BILL)**

What is SafeArrival?

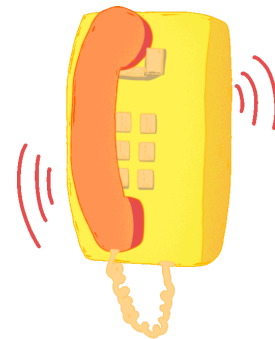
SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

You are asked to report your child's absence in advance whenever possible using one of these convenient methods:

SchoolMessenger app (free)

1. Provide your email address to the school.
2. Get the app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>).
3. Tap Sign Up to create your account.
4. Select Attendance from the menu, and then select Report an Absence.
Web and Mobile Web: go.schoolmessenger.com

1. Provide your email address to the school.
2. Go to the website.
3. Click Sign Up to create your account.
4. Select Attendance from the menu, then select Report an Absence

1. Call the toll-free, interactive telephone system.
2. Follow the instructions to report an absence. Call complete when confirmation number given.

Absences can be reported in advance:

24 hours/day

7 days a week

For any school day in the school term

Up to the cut-off time on the day of the absence

Before and after the show audiences are invited to enjoy our interactive lobby, featuring family activities, a bike & pedestrian safety station, a compost booth, and more!

Bike and Circuses is for everyone. Our bike, walk, and slow roll performances allow audiences to hit the trail at their own pace. 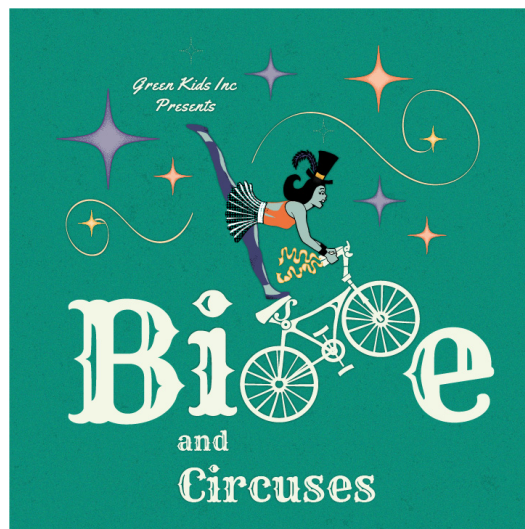
