



### Nursery and Kindergarten Registrations for 2022-2023

Nursery & Kindergarten registrations for **September 2022** are now being accepted.

Children entering **Nursery** must be 4 years old by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021 (born in **2018**).

Children entering **Kindergarten** must be 5 years old by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021 (born in **2017**).

Verification of age and address *must be provided* for new students registering.

Students now attending Nursery at Faraday School for the current school year are automatically registered in the Kindergarten program for the 2022-2023 school year.

This has been a very busy year! In Room 6 we went on a field trip to the Assiniboine Zoo at the end of May. We walked around the Zoo, and participated in a program learning about Arctic Animals and the adaptations they have developed to survive. This trip was a fun continuation and celebration of our year long learning about Arctic Animals.

Throughout the day we got to explore and interact with a wide variety of areas, animals, and artifacts. Our educator guide played games with us. One game was similar to ISPY, we searched for the animals hiding in the photos. We touched blubber, seal and arctic fox fur, and plastic re-creations of animal skulls. Gently we handled snowy owl feathers, and polar bear claws. As we left the classroom area we compared our foot to the footprint of a polar bear.

During our walking tour, we acted out how Musk Ox create circles of protection around their babies. Using horns to keep away gray wolves and other hunters. Our class watched polar bears and seals swimming and being playful. We also saw two newborn baby Caribou – so exciting! Some of the best learning happens through shared experiences.

**Room 8-Grades 1/2****Ms. E. Panelo**

Hello, Room 8 Families!

It has been such a wonderful year in our grade 1 and 2 classroom. We explored and built on our knowledge of what makes a community both inside and outside of the classroom. We will explore ways to contribute in small ways, such as not wasting food, and reducing our water use. We will also explore ways to contribute in big ways, such as designing and building a community garden to provide for families that can't afford certain foods.

Our classroom has been using the Thinking Classroom strategy to help students talk about their numeracy thinking. Students work together in groups to help each other talk about their thinking. Students also learned new games to practice their numeracy skills in a fun way.

We continued to develop our reading skills by working in reading groups alongside teachers and students from other classrooms. We also continued to work through the writing process in the classroom, while exploring poetry.

Our class will also be taking a trip to the public library so that our students can continue to grow their love for reading over the summer break.

I hope we can make the most of this last month together!

It's June already? Wow! What a year it has been! N/K students have been really busy wrapping up their school year. At the beginning of the Month of May, we planted flowers, watched them grow and enjoyed being part of this process from the beginning (seeds) until the end (leaves and budding blooms).

The students also participated in the "Social Justice" theme where they learned that being a 'mediator' or a class 'captain' comes with a lot of responsibilities. Each student in our classroom had an opportunity to be Ms.K's helper for the day. Not only did they assist with our carpet time activities, but they also were mediators of their peers.

We ended the month with a trip to the zoo, whereby our students didn't just enjoy visiting with and seeing the animals, but they also demonstrated their knowledge and understanding of the alphabet and letter sounds by telling our guide the first letters of all the animals they encountered along the way. It was such a rewarding experience for me to watch our children growing physically and developing emotionally within the last 10 months. I can confidently declare that each student is ready to move to the next level of his or her learning journey in September.

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

