# **Grant Park High School PACC Agenda**

## October 19, 2021 – 7:15 p.m.

#### **Regular reports – Administration**

#### a) Principal

Testing Clinic - To ensure the safety of our school community, WSD staff have an obligation to follow the direction of the Chief Provincial Public Health Officer and the Minister of Education. This direction, which was published in <u>The Public Health Act orders on September 24</u>, <u>2021</u> comes into effect on October 18, 2021. The direction requires that all staff provide either proof of full vaccination or proof of a negative test, completed within the past 48 hours (tests are done three times a week). Each week, a neutral third party must observe one of the tests.

WSD has hired a contract health care service to complete the observed once weekly test. Two locations in the division, Grant Park High School and Tec Voc High School, have been identified for testing clinics for unvaccinated employees to attend during nonworking hours.

The senior gymnasium at these locations were selected because employees coming for testing are not required to walk through the school to attend. The testing clinics will be set up and taken down each day for this purpose, followed by full cleaning and fogging.

Those staff who choose to take weekly testing have the option to provide proof of full vaccination at any time, which would mean they no longer require weekly testing. Significant staff numbers exercising this option will result in decreased volumes at test sites and potential decreases in the number of clinic days and or site locations.

• Return to School Sports - The Return to School Sports Guidelines have been developed to ensure all Public Health, Winnipeg School Division, and Provincial Sports Organizations health and safety protocols are in place to support the safe return to school sports for students and staff. The Guidelines have been updated to include additional information in the areas of live streaming and the Health and Safety Supervisor. We will continue to reevaluate and adapt as new information and guidelines become available. The Return to Sports Guidelines have been reviewed with all coaches, managers, and Team Health and Safety Supervisors.

- WSD Epi-pen Replacement Program The extra back-up EpiPens at our school will be expiring at the end of November. Northway Pharmacy will be delivering a replacement either Monday, November 15, 2021 or Monday, November 22, 2021. At this time, they will also pick up and properly dispose the expired EpiPen<sup>®</sup> through Stericycle.
- National Day of Truth and Reconciliation Virtual Assembly On Wednesday, September 29<sup>th</sup> our school community acknowledged the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation by wearing Orange, having a moment of silence, and participating in an online assembly at 1:20 p.m. The assembly consisted of a short video and a live presentation. Links were provided via email and all of our classes contributed questions or comments, where appropriate. Following the event students and staff were given the opportunity to participate in a smudging ceremony in our school courtyard.
- Visual and Performing Arts Partnerships A husband and wife artist team has contacted the school about collaborating with us by doing outreach with Inuit content. Bob Kussy is an alumnus of Grant Park and Goota Ashoona, was a large part of the new Inuit art exhibit at the WAG. They are both arts educators who have also just finished work with the Yellowknife School Board and have connections with the University of Manitoba's fine arts program. The pair are also connected with the Indigenous Film industry and we have begun discussions about providing student-programming opportunities in these areas. Our Visual and Performing Arts Department has also initiated discussions with École Secondaire Sisler High School to extend the WSD Create Program and explore joint programming in graphic design, motion picture arts and animation.
- Academic Success Learning Series The Academic Learning Series is a continuation of the work School Leaders and School Leadership Teams have journeyed together over the past two years (Collective Efficacy and PLCs). Our School Team includes the Indigenous Academic Achievement Representative accompanied by the Principal, Vice Principals, Guidance Representative and our Indigenous Graduation Coach.

This series will explore the historical experiences and contemporary realities of Indigenous Learning in Canada. Specific topics of study include: Indigenous teaching, learning methodologies and pedagogies, treaty education and its relationships, a political overview of the history of Indigenous Education in Canada, Residential Schools, teaching for inclusion, and teaching for reconciliation. As educators, we hold the unique opportunity to facilitate the renegotiation of relationships between all cultural groups and empower students to join the process of reconciliation in Canada. Over the five learning sessions, school teams will be engaged in a process of visioning how reconciliation might look in the classroom, the role of equitable education, and come away from the gathering with a continuous improvement action plan on how to implement evidence based strategies in their classrooms.
