

In the spirit of giving (something close to our hearts) the student council is doing a winter gear drive for Koats for Kids!



It has been a busy November of both individual and group activities for all grades.

News from French & Stem by Mr. Mont

STEM

STEM challenges have made an appearance in the science lab! Over the next couple of months, students will be challenged to grow and test their problem solving skills against activities carefully designed to develop the 'zero cluster' skills. Specifically, those skills are the ability to properly form a scientific inquiry string that will lead to a conclusion and to become more comfortable with the very important failures associated with the design process. Please ask your children about a recent activity where they had to design a solution to make dominoes fall up a set of 'stairs'. All Grosvenor students are scientists!

Francais

L'amélioration des conversations en français se continuent dans l'atelier de français. Les étudiants continuent d'agrandir leurs capacités de communiquer avec les autres, complètement en français! Récemment, les sixièmes à étaient charger de créer une phrase nouvelle qui explique comment une journée peut être froide et chaude à la même temps, par utiliser le vocabulaire et la conjugaison des verbes qu'ils ont appris en classe. Les 3/4/5ièmes ont appris le vocabulaire des objets de salle de classe et pratiquent à demander s'ils peuvent emprunter les objets des autres. Les 1/2ièmes continuent de s'amuser aux jeux en français et d'explorer à écouter et à répondre aux questions et salutations simple. Tous les enfants continuent de sauter par-dessus les barres qui devient toujours plus hautes. Nous sommes étonnés toujours à ce qu'ils peuvent accomplir quand ils ont l'occasion de briller.

French conversation continues to improve in the French workshop. Students continue to learn and grow their abilities to communicate with others, completely in French! Recently, the grade 6s were tasked with using learned vocabulary and verb conjugation to write completely novel sentences to describe how a day can be both cold and hot at the same time. The 3/4/5s have been learning vocabulary about classroom objects and how to ask to borrow them from someone. The 1/2s continue to have fun using French in exciting games and learning to listen to and respond to basic greetings and questions. The kids continue to jump over ever-ascending bars and we are all always amazed at what they can do when given a chance to shine.

Patrols:

With the cold weather here, patrols need to be dressed properly for the elements. Toques, mills, face masks, parkas, ski pants, boots and scarves are essential.

Patrols will go out on regular shifts, if the temperature is –24 or warmer (with windchill). Patrols will go out on a shortened shift if the temperature is –25 to –29 with the wind windchill. Patrols will not go out if the temperature is –30 or colder with the windchill. Morning patrols are encouraged to come to school prepared for their shift and the weather will be checked before they go outside.

WSD Cold Weather Guidelines for Schools





Student Arrival at School

• When the cold weather has truly arrived, we remind parents, guardians and students that they should arrive at school **NO EARLIER** than 8:45 am. If it is –28 degrees with windchill or colder, students will see a green card on the doors. This will signal them to come in the building through their cohort doors and go to their classroom.

<u>Indoor Recess Policy:</u>During the winter months, the wind chill is checked before morning recess, lunch time and afternoon recess. (The website used to confirm weather is:

https://www.weather.gc.ca/city/pages/mb-36_metric_e.html

- Students are expected to dress appropriately for the weather at all times. As per WSD policy, students will be kept indoors only on inclement days when the wind chill reaches –28° Celsius. When the wind chill is between –25° to –27°, students may go out for a shortened 10 minute recess.
- At times, parents and guardians have requested by a note to the classroom teacher or a phone
 call to the school, to have their child remain indoors at recess time. It is our school's belief that if
 a students is too sick to go outdoors at recess, then he or she is too sick to be at school.
