

French

The grade 1/2s continue to have fun exploring new French words and have really been getting a kick out of being able to respond in full sentences to questions asked of them in French.

STEM

January marked the completion of a series of STEM activities that focused on communication, planning, designing/building, and redesign after failure. Students really pushed themselves to find solutions to problems while truly having to work as a team to accomplish goals. This fantastic practice really helped our students become comfortable with failure and taught them to pick up where they left off and dive back into problem solving.

January also marked the completion of the STEM mural in the Science Lab. News from the Music Room by Ms. Hanton

The end of January in the music room traditionally means that our attention is turning to ideas for the annual spring concert. The students will learn about what types of performances they may be involved in and have been engaged in watching short video examples of students performing. This is to encourage critical thinking in what defines a successful performance and to create self-assessment rubrics. For many of our students, this will be the first time they have performed on a stage, and so we will be exploring how to be prepared so that we are excited rather than nervous! The chemicals produced in the body for both feelings are the same, so we will practice mindful strategies to channel excitement!

This year our concert will incorporate the theme of Grosvenor School turning 100 years old, and we will be travelling through a century of history, music, and dance on Thursday May 18, 2023, at 6:30 pm. Please mark this date on your calendar as it is an event for every student and their family in the school from Nursery through to Grade 6. This will be our first spring concert since the pandemic (my computer tried to self-correct that word to pandemonium!) and we are all extremely excited! We will be holding the concert in the well-equipped professional theatre housed in Tec Voc School. Our production team toured the facility last



week and was thoroughly impressed by the professional lighting, sound equipment, and large stage. The theatre has a seating capacity of 475 so there will be plenty of room for our audience. We will be charging \$10 per seat to offset production costs (including costumes, make-up, props, staging, stage crew, and any additional A.V. equipment required).

Ms Robbins and I will be creating a custom musical show using the research conducted by the classrooms on a decade in history between 1923 and 2023. Every child will be on the stage for the entire production, making this truly a night to remember.





Presentations on the following programs:

General – The General Program is offered to students attending Grant Park High School starting in grade 7 and continuing through to grade 12. All core subject areas follow the curricula as outlined by *Manitoba Education and Training*.

Advanced – Following the curricula as outlined by Manitoba Education and Training, the Advanced Program provides a disciplined academic environment in which students study subjects in greater depth and at a faster pace with an emphasis in critical thinking and analysis. Students must be at, or above grade level. High academic standards are required with the expectation of students to maintain a grade of at least 70% in order to continue on to the next grade.

Flex - The fundamental approach of the Flexible Learning classroom is to encourage students' natural interests by exploring broad themes within the curriculum. Students investigate topics and experience them through discussion, hands-on activities, research, group projects, and a wide variety of related explorations. Flexible Learning classrooms utilize multi-age groupings (grades 7 and 8) and are student-centered, activity-based, and thematically organized. Students must be at, or near grade level.


