Supporting your child at home


Parents can support their children at home by reading with them every night. Point out environmental signs while going for a walk.

Year Overview

Students of Room 4 will be in an inquiry-based learning environment, where the teacher provides questioning, prompting, observing, scaffolding, guiding and listening. The students will learn by discovering knowledge and answers through questioning, observing and listening with their peers and through several media sources.

English Language Art: Students will be learning, speaking, reading, writing and representing their thoughts, ideas, feelings, and experiences. They will make connections with the text, self and world through their reading and writing. Students will continue the school wide writing and reading approach called, The Units of Study. In writer's workshop, students will learn to write narrative stories, information writing, opinion writing and poetry. In reader's workshop, students will learn to read nonfiction books, amp up their reading power with bigger books, build good reading habits and be word detectives. We will have classroom celebrations, once each unit is completed to celebrate all the learning! Phonics lessons will be embedded into the daily E.L.A. schedule. We encourage parents to read aloud a story to their child for 15 minutes every night to help develop language and a love for reading in our students.

Math: Students will learn addition and subtraction facts, patterning, number sense, place value, measurement, problem solving and 3D objects & 2D shapes. Students will be participating in weekly mental math learning groups where students work on whiteboards with a partner.

Students in Room 4 will learn to identify numbers 0-100, identify and compare patterns, and skip count by 1s, 2s, 5s, 10s to 100.

Students will be learning mental math strategies, such as counting on, counting back, compatibles to ten, twenty, and fifty, doubles facts, addition and subtraction.

Students will be using a math program, called Dreambox to enhance their math learning every day at school.

Science: Students will be going on several community walks throughout the year to learn about the natural resources surrounding our community and the importance of the Red River and connecting our learning to Air and Water. Students will be learning about growth and changes with our butterfly unit in the spring, Students will learn about position and motion in objects. Students will be involved in fun hands on science experiments throughout the year.

Social Studies: Students will be connecting our Roots and Shoots project with our environment, our local community, school, culture, Canada, communities in Canada, Aboriginal communities, global connections, personal identities, and learning to connect with others. Students will learn about respect, responsibility and rights. Students will learn about Remembrance Day. We will be going on several community walks throughout the year to make maps of our community.

Art: Students will use art to explore and demonstrate awareness of the elements of art: line, colour, texture, shape, form and space. Students will use pastels, water colour paint, acrylic paints, plasticine clay, and several other mediums throughout the year.

Health: Students will identify healthy life style practices such as staying physically active to maintain a healthy body, maintaining clean dental hygiene practices, identifying personal safety and Canada's food guide to healthy eating choices.

Common Practices

At Lord Selkirk, we focus on PBIS (Positive Behaviour Interventions and Strategies) in our classroom management strategies.

The 3 B's:

Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Cooperative.

Room 4 will create a classroom respect agreement the first week of school. Students are expected to follow the rules every day. If students are not following the rules, they will have a warning. Once warned, we will have a conversation and come up with a solution. If necessary, a phone call home, meeting with parents and/or with our principal/guidance counsellor/resource teacher.

Student fees cover class supplies, art supplies and projects throughout the year. We are asking parents/guardians to purchase the \$4.00 Vortex headphones from Dollarama.
