### **Lunch Program News**

Hello Rockwood families!

A few reminders:

\*All children eat lunch in their own classroom from 12:00-12:30, and then everyone goes outside from 12:30-12:55. There is adequate supervision indoors and outdoors to ensure everyone will stay safe!

\*Microwaves are available for heating up food. Please do not send any type of noodles in cups such as KD, or Cup of noodles. We have had many issues with these in the past. We encourage food to be cooked beforehand at home, and then sent along in a **plastic microwaveable container (no glass)**.

Please send a juice box or water bottle (reminder: no Kool Aid jammers or pop). Please do not send glass containers. We have had many glass containers get accidentally dropped or knocked over and smash on the ground.

To those families that have post-dated cheques, they are cashed on the 20th of each month. Please ensure that you have funds to cover these fees in your account to avoid the NSF fee your bank will charge you as well as the NSF fee we will have to charge. During the lunch hour, we take attendance and account for each child that is registered at the lunch program every day. If your child has alternate arrangements for lunch, please let the school know, so the staff are aware of your child's whereabouts.

#### It's easy to enroll your child in No Child Without

Thanks to generous donors and supporters, the MedicAlert No Child Without program has protected over 66,000 children since 2006. No Child Without is offered free of charge to children ages 4 to their 14th birthday through over 6,000 participating public and Catholic schools across Canada.

If your child is attending a participating school, simply follow the steps below to enroll:

- Step 1: Complete the online form at *https://www.medicalert.ca/no-child-without/ncw-enrollment-info* to receive a unique bar code and PIN
  \*or pick up an enrollment brochure from the school office.
- Step 2: Visit the enrollment page at http://www.nochildwithout.ca/parent\_enrol.asp and enroll online or call 1-877-282-5378 (Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. EST).

After you complete the enrollment process, your child's MedicAlert protection (a \$60 annual value service plan) begins immediately. Your child will receive their free MedicAlert ID (a \$39 value), shipped by Canada Post directly to your home, in two to three weeks.



### **Mobile Vision Care Clinic Coming to Rockwood!**



Mobile Vision Care Clinic Clinic (MVCC) to provide complete vision care for all students at Rockwood School. Surprisingly, one in three children entering school has a

vision disorder. Many of these children accept poor vision and other eye problems because they are unaware that their vision is not the same as that of other children. The Canadian Association of Optometrists recommends that children receive a complete eye examination by an optometrist every 12 months after starting school.

In May, a team of two optometrists, a licensed optician, optometric assistants and eyeglass specialist(s) will attend your child's school to provide comprehensive eye exams with dilation and provide them with glasses, if required. Parents/guardians are invited to attend their child's appointment and to help with the selection of eyeglasses.

Manitoba Health covers the cost of children's eye exams and direct billing will be done by the Mobile Vision Care Clinic staff. For some students, eyeglasses may be covered through 3rd party insurance such as Employment Income Assistance (EIA), Non-Insured Health Benefits (Status) or a 3rd party insurance company. Funds are also being donated and raised for families who have no 3rd party

coverage and are not in a position to afford the cost of prescription eyeglasses.

If your child requires glasses, they will be delivered to your child's school. Eyeglass delivery and fitting will take place approximately 3 weeks after MVCC has been at the school. Additionally, if your child is identified as having a visual impairment, he or she will be referred to the appropriate specialist.

In order to have your child's eyes examined by the Optometrist, you will be to complete the required Eve Examination Consent Form (yellow form). Consent covers eye examinations (covered by Manitoba Health) for your child while their WSD registration is current. These forms will be sent home with students this month. Please complete one form per child, in full, and return it to the school immediately

#### **DID YOU KNOW...**

- More than 80% of learning relies on vision
- One in three children entering school has a problem with their vision
- Reading, learning and behaviour problems can be related to undetected vision disorders

### Attendance Reporting with School Messenger

**School Messenger** allows parents/guardians to report student absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations by phone, web or smartphone app. Parents/ guardians will report all absences through School Messenger **before 9:00 AM** and will not receive a phone call from the school. For safety reasons, in the event of an unexplained student absence, the system will communicate with parents in a timely manner.

There are three ways to report an absence:



**Phone:** Parents/guardians can call the toll free number **1-855-278-4513**; listen carefully to all the options, choose the appropriate absence and reason; wait for confirmation number.

**Internet:** Parents/guardians can log into the website: <u>https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</u> and sign up using the email address on file at Isaac Brock School and a password of your choosing. Absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations can be reported.

**iPhone or Android device:** If you would like to use an app on your smart phone: Download the free app through the App Store or Google Play; search **School Messenger**; install the blue app and sign up using the email address on file at Isaac Brock School and a password of your choosing. Absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations can be reported.

### Absences must be reported to School Messenger no later than 9:00 am on the day of the absence.

### **Traffic Safety Reminders**

When you drop your child off at school in the morning on Fleet or Rockwood and there are patrols on duty, please make sure your child walks to a corner where there is a patrol. It is dangerous to have children running out in the middle of the street - especially a busy street like Fleet. The mornings can feel rushed and it is cold outside, but the safety of all students is our priority.



- There is **no stopping** on the East side of Rockwood from Dudley to Fleet from 8AM to 4PM.
- The West side of Rockwood from Dudley to Fleet is a **loading zone** from 8AM to 4PM, except in the intersection of Garwood which is a **No Stopping zone** kept **clear for the patrols**.
- We have the small loading zone on Fleet.
- The staff parking lot should never be used for pick up and drop off This is not a drop off and pick up zone or pedestrian corridor.

### What to do when you have a problem at your child's school

- If the issue is still not settled talk to the Director for your child's school. The Directors are part of the Superintendents' Office and may involve other members of the Superintendents' team in the discussion.
- If these steps don't help you resolve the issue – then you should contact the Board and Community Liaison Officer who will work with you and the Board of Trustees to find a solution.
