Our school has an enrolment of approximately 250 students, supported by 20 teachers, a Community Support Worker and 18 auxiliary staff members including educational assistants, clerks and custodians. Additionally, our school receives assistance from Clinical Support Services, which includes a Reading Clinician, Psychologist, Speech Language Pathologist and Social Worker.

We pride ourselves on creating an inclusive educational environment that fosters interactive, innovative and authentic learning experiences. Although the majority of the school year has looked very different due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have continued to support students with opportunities to achieve academic excellence, build upon their self-esteem and develop social responsibility, while following all public health restrictions. We provide experiences both in and out of the classroom, which promote tolerance and understanding, self- discipline and independence. Strathcona School fosters an environment where all children feel accepted, valued and individuality is celebrated.




















Divisional Priorities for 2021-2022
