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School mission statement

École Waterford Springs School provides an inclusive environment that promotes student learning through a growth mindset and allows children to develop a sense of community as well as giving back to their community.



About our school

École Waterford Springs School is a Nursery to Grade 8 dual track school with approximately 724 students. The school was built in 2019-2020 and officially opened its doors to the community on January 4, 2021 during the COVID pandemic. We currently have a principal, a vice-principal, 36 teachers, 14 educational assistants, 3 clerical staff and 4 custodial staff. Other programs offered include integrated inclusive education, Home Reading, Parent-run Lunch Program, and French to all of our Kindergarten to grade 8 students in the English Program.

École Waterford Springs School provides a Guidance Counsellor, SERT/Resource Teacher, Children's Support Services staff, classroom integrated technology, a leadership program and a patrol program. BumperCrop ECLC runs a before and after program for students who attend the school in grades 1-6.





Priorities for 2021-24

Strengthen instructional and assessment strategies for all students using all available resources including the integration of technology. Example:

Teachers continued tracking student progress in Mathematics, English and French reading and writing, three times a year. The data was used to plan instruction for students. Many students showed an increase in their numeracy, reading and writing skills.

All students, regardless of their program, learn French from Kindergarten to grade 8.

Improve academic and behaviour support services for students with special needs. Example:

Individual Education Plans were put in place for students to meet the academic needs of students who needed more support or worked above grade level expectations.

Strengthen and enhance Education for Sustainable Development initiatives that address environmental, social and economic issues world-wide. Example:

Recycling was a main focus this year and students and staff worked together to learn about appropriate recycling.

Further improve school attendance and future graduation rates through the exploration of additional programs and strategies.

The Safe Arrival call-in system used in the school to track and report student attendance.
