Priorities for 2020-2021

1. <u>Literacy</u> programming to follow Read2me framework for instruction. Students to receive small group targeted instruction one hour per day at their level. Strengthen instructional and assessment strategies for all students using all available resources including the integration of technology.

Examples:

Reading Framework in Grade 1-3 including integration of smart TV and IPads,

2) Improve academic and behavior support services for all students

Examples:

Recovery learning focus, targeted instruction, reviewing data regularly, positive and proactive programming focused on social, emotional learning

3) Strengthen and enhance Education for Sustainable Development initiatives that address environmental, societal and economic issues world-wide.

Examples:

School Treaty-focus on oral storytelling, Expansion of the Community Garden Project and student opportunities with Community Organizations

4) Further improve school attendance and graduation rates through the exploration of additional programs and strategies

Examples:

School wide breakfast, lunch and snack programs, Meet the Staff night, Breakfast with Santa, Parent Council, Community Involvement



Priorities for 2020-2021

1) Numeracy programming to emulate the structure of the Read2Me framework for instruction in order to increase comprehension and be able to model and communicate their understanding more efficiently.

Examples:

- 1) small targeted instruction that embeds differentiation and adaptations to ensure success
- 2) Students will receive targeted instruction based on the triangulation of data (Math pathways, Number talks and classroom observation.
- 3) Utilization of Thinking classrooms to increase communication within small groups
- 4) Integrated resource support to assist with small group instruction
- 2) Improve academic and behavior support services for all students

Examples:

- 1) Continue to review academic data and then utilizing spirals of learning and targeted instruction to achieve successful outcomes
- 2) Continue to create, review and revise Behaviour Intervention Plans
- 3) Create proactive student success plans
- 4) Continue to strengthen social emotional programming throughout all classrooms
- 3) Continue to strengthen and enhance Education for Sustainable Development initiatives that address environmental, societal and economic issues world-wide.

Examples:

- 1) School treaty-continue to focus on oral story telling
- School theme focus across curriculum/grades-focus on the question" Why Are We Here? Our Relationship to Our Mother the Earth
- Continue the expansion of the Community Garden Project (adding garden boxes/create an outdoor garden play area as well as adding an additional outdoor learning space)
