About Earl Grey School

Earl Grey School is now 106 years old!!! We are a Nursery – Grade 8 School that offers a full day Kindergarten Program, 2 year and 3 year Multiage Programs, a Spanish Bilingual Program and an All-Girls and All-Boys Multiage Junior High Program. Our Spanish Program includes Kindergarten to Grade 5 with plans to extend one grade per year.

We offer French to our Grade 4-8 students and Spanish to our Grade 7/8 Students. Students from Grade 4-8 are engaged in student-centred learning and work with mentors do explore their passions and big questions.

We value outdoor education and try to get outside as much as possible to explore in our outdoor classroom, gardens and community. We work hard to create citizens who care for their environment and what is happening in the world.

Our Phys. Ed, Arts programs and extracurricular activities are integral to educating the whole child and developing our School Spirit and Community.

We work closely with our Families to make sure that they feel welcome, valued and part of our School Community.

- Planted an Orange Garden in memory of the children that did not survive their time at Residential Schools.
- Earl Grey K (Kilometre) walks through the community happened throughout the year. Many walks include interacting with community by dancing and waving through windows, and hanging notes and decorations on trees.
- Marked Black History Month by learning about Black leaders, reading a wide variety of books by Black authors, and Grade 5-8 students attended a virtual field trip to the Manitoba Museum.
- Built school spirit by creating cohort shields and colours. These shields and colours were celebrated on Fun Fridays throughout the year.
- Grade 5/6 students participated in a weekly STEM Club from April – June.
- Grade 7/8 students participated in Outdoor Education and learned team building skills.
- Grade 7/8 students participated in a province-wide Math Kahoot.
