About our school

Kent Road School is a Nursery to Grade 6 school serving families in the East Elmwood community. The school population consists of 260 children in a multicultural community where approximately 20% of the students come from homes where a language other than English is spoken. There are 18 Teachers and 12 Educational Assistants, with Ainslie Loria as principal.

Children are challenged daily in their academic subjects, also benefitting from enrichment and adaptations as needed. Once again this year, physical education and our performing arts program had to operate a little differently, and our teachers and students rose to the challenges presented by COVID-19.

As the year progressed, we were able to do more and more activities together including attending the WSD Pow Wow, and having our Spirit Up! activity day.

Parent and community involvement

The Kent Road Parent Council works closely with the school administration to support all areas of the school. The Parent Council meets approximately 5 times per year in the evenings to promote parental involvement at the school. They also offer a supervised lunch program for students whose parents work or live a fair distance from the school. Any parent or guardian of Kent Road students is welcome to join.

Due to COVID-19, we were not able to have parent or community volunteers in the school again this year however, our parents and community were still very involved in supporting the school and our students.

In our community, the East Elmwood Community Centre serves as our emergency evacuation site. In September, you may see the whole school walking to the EECC and back as part of our safety protocols, should there ever be a need for us to evacuate the school.
