École Laura Secord School is a Nursery to Grade 6 school located in the heart of Wolseley. We offer two programs: the French Immersion Program and the English Alternative Program. We have 33 teachers, including specialist teachers for Music, Physical Education, Inclusive Education, Reading Recovery, French Immersion Literacy Support, and Guidance. In addition, we have a number of Educational Assistants, two office clerks, and 4 custodians. Our school is further supported by staff at Clinical Support Services.

The YMCA operates a Before and After School program during the school year and our Lunch Program is run by our Parent Council.

Our Parent Advisory Council, in a non-Covid year, organizes various fund-raising events during the school year as well as a monthly Fun Food lunch. PAC planned and fundraised for our new nature playground, which was installed in May 2020. We are a proud member of the UNESCO Associated Schools Project Network. As a UNESCO School, we work together to ensure the UNESCO goals: sustainable development, cultural education, and awareness and are taught in all classrooms through curricular connections.
