Lord Selkirk School is an elementary school located in the heart of Winnipeg's Elmwood community, a block east of Henderson Highway on Poplar Ave. We provide programming for Nursery to Grade 6 students with 20.37 full time equivalent teaching staff. This is our 6th year providing a "Full Day Kindergarten" program for our community. In addition to our engaging and relevant academic programming, we offer an Arts program with Dance, Music and Drama, as well as an active and dynamic physical education program.

We regularly review and evaluate data and school priorities asking questions like: "What is going on for our learners?", "What will have the greatest impact?", and "What do we need to learn to prepare ourselves?" This enables use to apply best practices based on research and fosters our collective vision for our learners.



Priorities for 2020-2021

Literacy Goal: By the end of June 2021, 80% of all students from Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be reading and writing at or above grade level. The “Units of Study in Reading and Writing” will be used in all classrooms to support individualized growth and development of skills. The OLM and workshop model will be used in all classrooms.

Numeracy Goal: By the end of June 2021, 80% of all students from Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be independent in math grade level outcomes. Teachers will plan lessons using the 7 mathematical processes of the curriculum to foster mathematical thinking. Teachers will implement a balanced math program that builds number sense, fluency and problem solving. Dreambox will be used to support instruction and assessment of math learning school wide.

ESD Goal: At the end of June 2021, each classroom will have been engaged in a “Roots and Shoots” inquiry project that supports positive change for people, animals and the environment with a focus on community partnerships.

PBIS Goal: By the end of June 2021, 80% each classroom will be engaged in learning and following the school expectations (Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Cooperative). By the end of June 2021, 10% less students will require an IEPLP/BIP.



Priorities for 2021-2022

Literacy Goal: By the end of June 2022, 80% of all students from Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be reading and writing at or above grade level. The Units of Study approach will be used in all classrooms as our primary resource for achieving this goal.

Numeracy Goal: By the end of June 2022, 80% of all students from Kindergarten to Grade 6 will be at or above grade level in mathematics outcomes. Thinking Classrooms and Number Talks will be our primary approach for achieving this goal.

ESD Goal: By the end of June 2022, each classroom will have engaged in a Roots and Shoots 4 step model that supports positive change for people, animals and the environment in the Elmwood community, while embedding truth and reconciliation education.

Safe and Caring Goal: By the end of June 2022, 90% of students will be using proactive strategies to engage in learning and following school expectations (Be safe, Be Respectful, Be Cooperative). Students will have an increased awareness of how they contribute to an inclusive school community.
