

By January 2021, 80% of Grade 7 students will meet or exceed midgrade performance in all sub-competencies in the Grade 7 provincial assessments for numeracy.

By January 2021, 80% of Grade 8 students will meet or exceed midgrade performance in all sub-competencies in the Grade 8 provincial assessments for reading comprehension.
