Why is This an Issue

In 2019, a national MMIWG inquiry found that Canada's "assimilationist and genocidal government laws" against indigenous people lead to high rates of violence against indigenous women, girls, and LGBTQ2S+.



The Issue

Defining the Problem:

- Indigenous women and girls face murder and violence 10 x higher than the national average. Murder is the 3rd leading cause of death for native women.
- We believe that the problem stems from:
 - Systematic racism
 - Stereotypes
 - Lack of Support
 - Unsafe Environment
 - Predisposed Generational Trauma

WHY?

Government based research is inaccurate. Community-based research found levels of violence against Indigenous women is significantly higher than government reported surveys.

Government statistics are based on police-collected data, the reality is 6 out of 10 incidents are NOT reported to police. This would make the data skyrocket if it was accurately recorded.

On top of this there is no police standard on how to track violence experienced by indigenous . The rcmp **does not** collect this data **at all** even considering they cover 75% of canada's geography and they cover 630 Indigenous communities.




Statistics

- Indigenous Women (girls +) murdered 10x higher than all other ethnicities.
- Murder is the 3rd leading cause of death for Indigenous Women (Centers for Disease Control).
- More than 4 out of 5 Indigenous Women have experienced violence (84.3%) (National Institute of Justice Report).
- More than half Indigenous Women experience sexual violence (56.1%).
- More than half Indigenous Women have been physically abused by their intimate partners (55.5 percent).
- less than half of Indigenous Women have been stalked in their lifetime (48.8 percent).
- Indigenous Women are 1.7 times more likely than Anglo-American women to experience violence.
- Indigenous Women are 2xs more likely to be raped than Anglo-American white women.
- Murder rate of Indigenous Women is 3xs higher than Anglo-American women.

02 Community Support


- Spreading awareness
