We offer Nursery to Grade 6 in the English track and Kindergarten to Grade 6 in the French Immersion track.

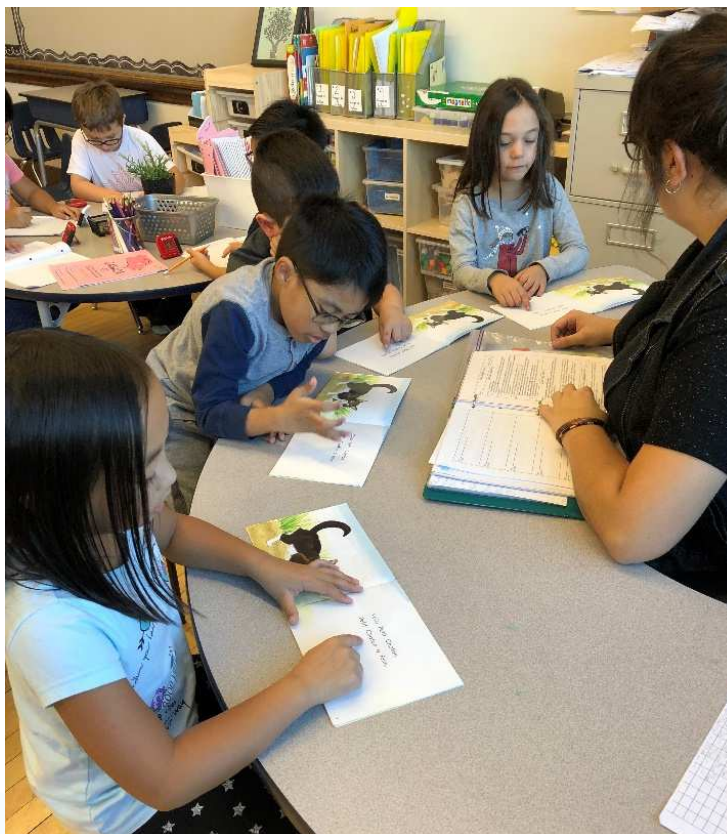
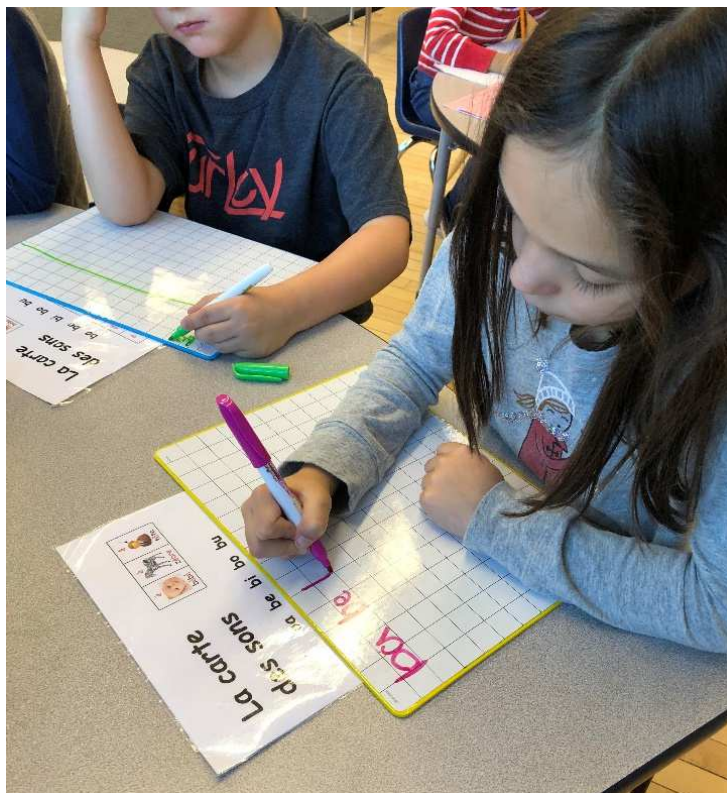
