

WSD School Entry Screening

Hello! Welcome to our school. In order for us to comply with current Public Health Orders, we must screen everyone before they can enter the building.

I'm just going to ask you a few questions and then ask you to sign in for our records.

Have you completed the online self-screening tool today?

If no: That's okay, you can complete screening questions right now (give them a paper copy of the screening tool)

If yes: Did you answer yes to any of the questions online?

If no: Thank you. Please sign here to confirm that your answer to the questions on the self-screening tool were all no.

If yes: In that case, I'm sorry but you are not able to enter our school today. Please return home and I'll inform your (or your child's) teacher that you will need to reschedule.

Next I'll explain quickly the process inside our school. Please use the hand sanitizer here or if you prefer you can wash your hands with soap and water in the bathroom (located closest to entry).

While you are inside the school, you must always follow the arrow signs on the floors to reach your classroom or another part of the school.

You must remember to always try and stay two meters apart from other people. If you sneeze or cough, try to do it into your sleeve and not your hands, and you should immediately go and wash your hands afterward.

Do you have any questions?

Allow them to enter school (younger children into the care of their teacher)



Self-screening tool

- 1. Do you (or your child if being completed by parent) have a new onset of any of the following symptoms?
 - a. Fever/chills
 - b. Cough
 - c. Sore throat/hoarse voice
 - d. Shortness of breath
 - e. Loss of taste or smell
 - f. Runny nose
 - g. Muscle aches
 - h. Fatigue
 - i. Pink eye (Conjunctivitis)
 - j. Headache
 - k. Skin rash of unknown cause
 - I. Nausea or loss of appetite
- 2. Have you been in contact in the last 14 days with someone that is confirmed to have an active case of COVID-19?
- 3. Have you had laboratory exposure while working directly with specimens known to contain COVID-19?
- 4. Have you been in a setting in the last 14 days that has been identified by public health as a risk for acquiring COVID-19 such as on a flight, in a workplace with a cluster of cases, or an event?
- 5. Have you travelled outside of Manitoba in the last 14 days, excluding personal travel to border communities? (Note that workers who routinely travel interprovincially for work and those involved in commercial transportation of goods and services are excluded)
