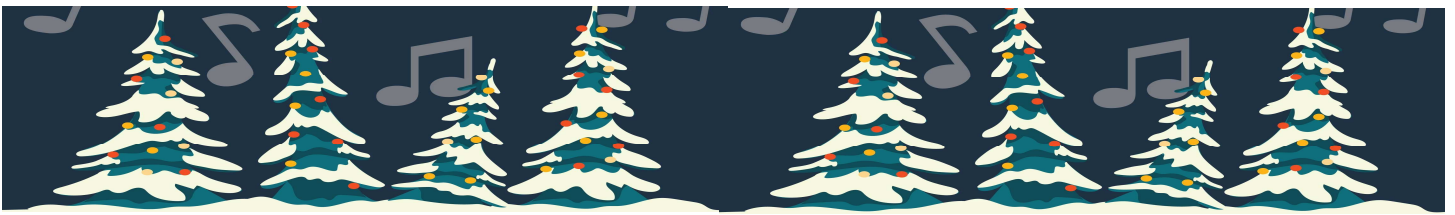
2023 will bring new and exciting opportunities for all. The next six months of school will continue to challenge thinking, develop community and to provide rewarding educational opportunities for our students.

Grade 3 & 4 News by Mr. Young:

Math by Ashton and Tyrique: In math, we do lots of math and hard math. It is so fun math. Is the best you should try. You can do easy math and hard math, blocks, bricks and sticks are the easy things for math we do. The plus sign is for adding, we do subtraction for the minus sign. In Dreambox we do so much hard and easy learning. Also Mr. Young would like to note that in December we worked on the mental math strategies, splitting tens and ones, empty number line and column addition and subtraction in order to solve multi digit addition and subtraction questions.

Reading by Kylie: In reading we do SQRIT, reading groups, and levelled reading. In SQRIT also known as silent reading all students are told to read their library books or books from the classroom. Us students read a books silently with no talking. In reading groups students have assigned reading groups made by their reading level. There is a basket of books to read for each of the reading levels. Level reading is when students have to read books from there reading level for example me kylie reading level T-W books from Raz kids or just a books from the reading shelf. We will not all of us enjoy reading but it's a good way to learn to new books and new vocabulary. **Writing By Sehaj** In our journal we do writing like our weekend or other stuff based on personal experience. Quick writes we get prompts and respond to those in writing. In retell, is something that we retell a book and do the setting, characters, problem and solution. Creative writing you can make up a story about anything. **Art by Reet:** For art we did hand drawing, winter shading, line drawing, and our Mandala colouring books that we colour when we finish work early. Hand drawing, we trace our hand on a piece of paper and used warm and cool colours. Winter shading, we drew winter in the forest with our pastel crayons and used a paper towel to shade it. Line drawing (which we just started doing) we draw lines and ovals and colour them in when we finish our designs. Last we have our Mandala colouring books. Theses books are used when students are finish there work early. Each page there is a different drawing to colour.

Phys. Ed By Avery and Denny: Phys extends are flexibility and teaches us different sports. There are many incredible sports that Ms. McFadyen teaches us. There are a lot of running and energetic games that Ms. M teaches us. Our favourite game in gym is "Zombie tag". At the end of every school month Ms. Mcfadyen picks 2-1 student from each class as sports star. As the sport star or stars get to pick what to do at the end of gym class. **Music by Kayleigh and Olivia.** Winter concert: The songs we are working on are going great.. We dance and sing along with Ms. Higham. Everyone is having lots of fun. Recorder: We learned 2 or 3 songs already called Mary had a Little Lamb and the Long Legged Soldier. And we are learning something new now. The new song we are learning is a German Song. We do fun stuff at the end of music class.

This month has been super busy in our room. We are excited to share all the new things we have learned in December. We learned new things in math, learned about being safe on the internet, wrote a story for a writing contest, and completed a research project on a piece of technology used to explore space. We hope you enjoy reading about it all.

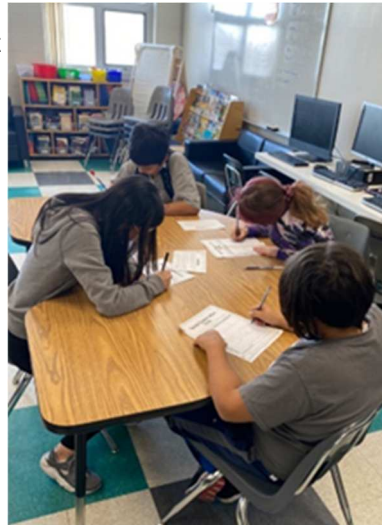
In math, we have been working on recognizing and determining patterns and finding missing variables in various equations. When determining patterns, we have been focusing on how patterns increase and decrease through the 4 operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division). In our algebra lessons we have been competing t-tables to determine a missing variable. We continue to use Dreambox for 30 minutes each day and it is noticeable how much it helps when we have regular math class.

In health, we have been discussing personal safety with a focus of being safe on the internet. There are many things we discussed, but three of the ones that really stand out to us are 1. Creating a username that does not include any personal details. 2. Creating a password that is difficult to guess and easy to remember. 3. Discussing what kind of information we should avoid posting online and sharing with people we do not know. Overall internet safety has been really important and we were able to finish our unit by watching a presentation from the Winnipeg Police.

In ELA, we have finished writing polar expression stories. Our polar expression stories are for a contest, where the winners will have their story published in a polar expression book! It was exciting to see all the different stories that were created and it is very noticeable how much effort our class put into this writing. We hope to see many published authors in our room when the contest results are announced in March next year.

In science, we completed our unit on the solar system and now know so many things about space that we never knew before. We learned about the planets, the moon, various objects in space such as comets, asteroids and meteors, learned about Canadian achievements in space, how technology is used to explore space and learned about how astronauts meet their daily needs in space. As you can tell, we have learned a lot.

Time is always moving so fast. It's hard to believe that we're already starting a new year. Read on to see what we did in the last month of 2022!

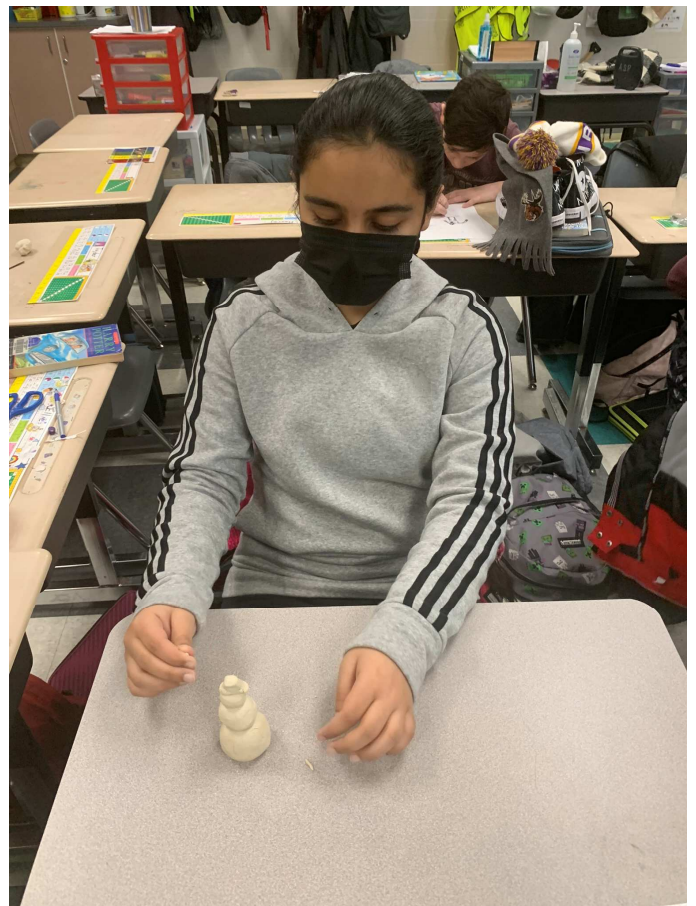
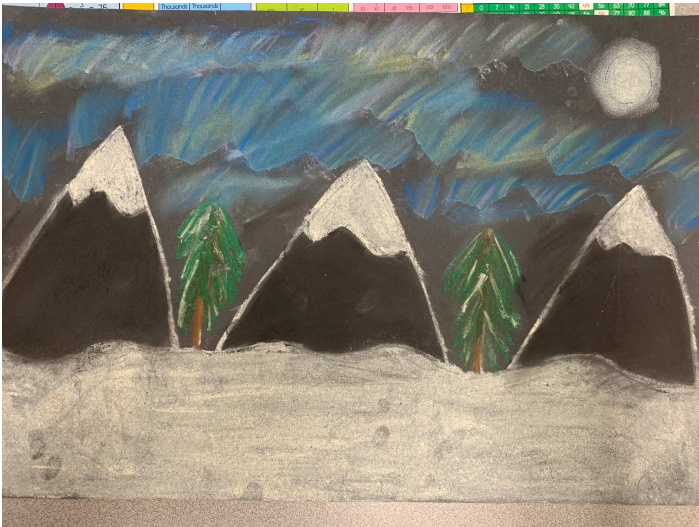

Each month the Lunch Program and the Parent Council will be holding a Pizza Lunch to raise funds to help pay the staff supervising students in the Lunch Program.

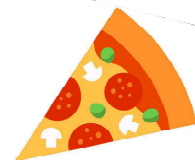
