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Dear Families,

WELCOME back to school!

I hope that all of our families had fun together and stayed healthy during the summer months. The new school year will bring many learning opportunities for students, staff and our community members. The 2022–23 school year will be full of new opportunities for learning, field trips, academic exploration, social justice, and Indigenous cultural activities. I look forward to seeing all of our returning and new eagles this September.

We would like to welcome the following staff to the Norquay Family: Ms. Scott (Vice-Principal), Adam Rush (Physical Education teacher), Catherine Woods (Arts teacher), Kevin Roberts (Gr. 5/6 teacher), and Nitasha Sharma-Patti (Gr. 5/6 teacher).

In addition to having regular scheduled fire drills (once a month), we will also be practicing a, school wide evacuation (one only), lockdown and hold & secure drills (three per school year) for the 2022-23 school year. These drills are not intended to alarm students, but rather ensure that they are aware of what to do should an emergency situation arise. It's imperative that all drills happen quickly and effectively and we will practice a lockdown this month. Please refer to the information below that details lockdown and hold & secure procedures. LOCKDOWN - THREAT INSIDE THE BUILDING:

- ·An unwanted intruder has entered the school building.
- ·All classrooms in the school are secured and locked, and the students are kept inside the classroom with the lights off and away from the windows.
- ·Staff will be given the "all clear" by the school Principal when the threat is over.

HOLD AND SECURE - OUTSIDE THREAT:

- ·If the threat is outside the building (for example, in the neighbourhood), ALL the doors leading outside will be locked so that no one can enter the building. Staff will be posted at each door. We will refer to this as a Hold & Secure.
- ·An announcement will be made via the intercom to inform staff and students of the threat and the conditions of the "Hold and Secure".
- •Students and staff will NOT be allowed to leave the building until the threat is over however, they will be able to continue moving to classes within the building.
- ·Remain calm and proceed as usual until you hear that the "Hold & Secure" has been lifted.

Once again, will continue to use our proactive office referral system at Norquay and it will take effect on the first teaching day in the fall. The office referral strategy /form assist teachers with the behaviour management of the classroom and aligns with the school's proactive strategies that are already (P.B.I.S, Zones of Regulation and Restorative Practices) in place at Norquay. The way the system works is as follows:

- a) Multiple attempts are made by the teacher to deal with the undesirable behaviour in the classroom by using proactive strategies.
- b) If the undesirable behaviour(s) continue to happen, the teacher will complete the office referral form (pink card) and the student is sent to the office to see the Principal.
- c) The Principal will meet with the student and will continue to use proactive strategies to resolve the concern or undesirable behaviour. The actions taken by the Principal will be indicated, on the back of the office referral form (pink card). If the student is able to fix the behaviour, he or she will be permitted to re-enter the classroom. The teacher will be notified by the Principal of the actions taken.
- d) The office referral form (pink card) will be sent home with the student at the end of the day and a parent and/or guardian must read and sign the back of the office referral form (pink card). The student is required to bring the form back to the school the next day and hand it in directly to the office. If the form is not returned then a call to the parent and/or guardian is made by the school and will result in further actions taken by the Principal.
- e) If the student is unable to fix the behaviour or the actions of the student do not align with the Winnipeg School Division Code of Conduct then a suspension could be issued by the Principal. In the event of a suspension, the parent and/or guardian will be contacted by the Principal directly and no office referral form (pink card) will be sent home. The parent will receive a letter from the school indicating the details of the suspension. A suspension is always a "last resort" action and we will always try to resolve the problem or undesirable behaviour at the school first.
- f) The continual support of parents and/or guardians is needed to build a stronger sense of safety, optimism, pride and place for all learners here at Norquay.

Norquay-Seven Teachings and Monthly Assembly Monthly Calendar Theme for 2022-23:

The Seven Scared Teachings will be our school wide monthly theme for the 2022-23 school year. Each month, all classrooms including Physical Education and Art(s) will incorporate that months teaching into a lesson or lessons(s), the amount of lessons to be taught will be at the teacher's discretion.

During our monthly assemblies (starting in October), a grade or grades will be responsible for giving a short 5–10 minute presentation on the teaching they have received. The Seven Teachings school theme will officially start on Monday, October 3, 2022. Here are the following teachings with the month and classroom(s). Norquay School will continue to hold daily smudging in the morning, which gives Indigenous and non-Indigenous students and staff the opportunity to learn about different cultures and share their teachings with one another. Smudging is a common cultural practice to many Indigenous people across Turtle Island. Smudging is done by burning one or all of our sacred medicines (sage, cedar, sweet grass, tobacco) to create a smoke to help cleanse ourselves and the environment around us of negative energies so we can walk in a good way.

We will be using sage that was harvested this fall. The following teaching is spoken by the individual leading the smudge to all participants. This teaching was created by the divisional Elder and has been passed on to our smudging circle. Here is the teaching that your child will hear during the smudging; "We smudge to clear the air around us. We smudge to clean our minds so that we'll only have good thoughts of others. We smudge our eyes so that we'll only see good things in others. We smudge our ears so that we'll only listen to good things about others. We smudge our mouths so that we'll only speak of good things about others. We smudge our whole being so that we may portray only the good part of our self through our actions.

This is voluntary and will be held outside of the school daily at 8:40 a.m. and the value of this experience at the school will be measured by the number of individuals that will attend our daily Smudges. This experience is part of our efforts to support the 94 Calls To Action and the TRC. If you have any questions regarding this traditional Indigenous practice or want to attend, please contact me at the school.

Norquay School will be holding two, **Indigenous community feast** to celebrate our school and community during the 2022–23 school year. Our goal is to have four feasts a year to honour Indigenous traditions of coming together to celebrate each other and the changing of the seasons. Our tentative dates for the feasts are **Wednesday**, **November 23, 2022 and Wednesday**, **April 26, 2023.** Our feasts are open to all members of the school and the community. More details to follow and letters will be sent home to all families within the next couple of months with updates.

21 Leaders Program for 2022-23:

This year, Norquay will continue to embark on a leadership journey with our grade 6 student leaders. We are looking at identifying and interviewing a variety of students that will lead by example, promote the school code of conduct and be an active citizen of the community (with your support & input). We are looking at having 10–20 students represent the grade six student body this year. Mr. Crowchild with the support of Ms. Semchuk, and Ms. Scott will lead the 21 Leaders team and we anticipate an unforgettable year.

If selected, your son or daughter **may** have the opportunity (depending on safety and health protocols due to COVID-19) to take part in the Community Leadership Program Day Camp which will be supported by LaFarge. More information to follow regarding the proposed plan for the Day Camp portion of the 21 Leaders program. However, your child will volunteer their time in our school and within the community as part of the program. Again, the leadership team will be called, "21 Leaders" and the students will have a variety of leadership opportunities at the grade 6 level. The reason for the name "21 Leaders" was simple, the students we have now are the leaders of the 21st century and we want them to take ownership of their futures. The students will have many opportunities to discover themselves and obtain valuable skillsets that will assist them as adults through this project.

The 21 Leaders team of Norquay School is a group of individuals that have the desire to plan and support opportunities that build unity, school spirit, and citizenship at the school. The 21 Leaders support school priorities, code of conduct, and planned events throughout the year. Our primary goal is to exemplify the leadership model of "Global Citizenship" to its end; we will take on any number of school wide service projects that will assist our school in becoming a community of understanding and learning. Students will also meet periodically with the grade level teams and discussion school wide student concerns and interests. This way, by the time they are in grade 7, they will have a good understanding of what, "Student Leadership" is all about and can sign up to be part of the leadership team at their future Jr. High School.

Once the students have been selected and parents notified by the Principal via a letter. The schools 21 Leadership team will hold a family night at the school in the fall and go we will over in detail the expectations, Leadership Day.
