
Fire Safety Month











Grade 1 Rm 27

Students in grade 1 will continue to use objects and manipulatives to practice math skills and show math thinking.




ELECTRONICS - STUDENT'S IN ACTION

School Messenger allows parents/guardians to report student absences, late arrivals, early departures and vacations by phone, web or smartphone app. Parents/guardians will report all absences through **School Messenger before 9:00 AM** and will not receive a phone call from the school. **Please do not email or leave voicemails regarding absences**. School Messenger will call home regarding all absences unless they are entered into the School Messenger system through one of the options below.
