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Who is Eligible?

Children are eligible for coverage if they are:

- a) more than 6 months old:
- b) less than 27 years old; and
- c) live in Canada, except the province of Quebec.

If a child is 14 years old or older at any time during the Coverage Period, they must be a full-time student within the 12 months prior to any claim. We define a full-time student as being enrolled in a minimum of 3 courses at the same time, during any 4-month period.

Stay in school or stay home?

Children who are well should go to school – that means they have none of the symptoms of COVID-19. Students who have unwell siblings can stay in school, provided they are well and have no symptoms of COVID-19 themselves.

FULLY VACCINATED STUDENTS must stay home if they...

- . Are unwell or showing symptoms of COVID-19
- . Are waiting for results of a COVID-19 test
- Have tested positive for COVID-19
- · Have been directed by Public Health to self-isolate

UNVACCINATED OR PARTIALLY VACCINATED STUDENTS must stay home if they...

- Are unwell or showing symptoms of COVID-19
- . Are waiting for results of a COVID-19 test
- Have tested positive for COVID-19
- Are a close contact to a positive COVID-19 case*
- Have a household member who has tested positive for COVID-19*
- Have personally traveled outside of Manitoba in the past 14 days*
- Have a household member who has traveled outside of Manitoba in the last 14 days and is now sick with COVID-19 symptoms
- . Have been directed by Public Health to self-isolate

*Unless Public Health communicates otherwise to the school principal
