SCHOOL INFORMATION

<u>Arrival at School</u>

School hours are: 8:50am – 12:00pm (N/K morning program ends at 11:30) and 12:55pm – 3:30pm. **Students are** strongly encouraged to arrive no earlier than 8:45am for morning classes and 12:50pm for afternoon classes, unless being supervised by a parent/guardian. All students will meet their teachers on the back hardtop for entry.

<u>Lates & Appointments</u>

Please do everything possible to ensure that your child is on time in order to follow all of the arrival steps. Should your child be late, please come to the front doors on McKenzie St. and ring the bell for office staff to assist. If your child is being picked up early, please call the office ahead at 204-586-8394 so that we can have your child ready to go. Your child will be walked outside to meet you at the front doors.

<u>Dismissal</u>

Students will be walked outside with their teacher into their pick up and drop off line on the hard top. Parents/guardians and older siblings will pick up students from their designated line. **Please do not double park or stop along Alfred Avenue for pickup.**

<u>School Supply Fees</u>

Friendly reminder to please pay your child's school supply fees during the month of September. The teacher will issue you a receipt for the \$30.00 fee per child. The funds collected enable teachers to plan wonderful learning experiences, and give students access to the tools they need to learn, create, and grow. Thank you to those families who have already paid!





WATER BOTTLES

We highly recommend students bring refillable water bottles to school each day. We have a water bottle filling station on our lower floor, where students can refill their water bottle throughout the day.



WEARING A MASK

Update: As of March 15, 2022 masks are no longer mandatory in schools. **Winnipeg School Division continues to recommend the use of masks.** At this time, we will continue to provide medical grade masks for students and staff if they choose to wear one. Students can also bring their own masks from home. That being said, we respect all of our families individual choices regarding the continued use of masks.



RAPID ANTIGEN TESTS

Our school office still has remaining rapid antigen test (RAT) kits available for families to use at home. Public health continues to recommend staying home if you have symptoms of Covid-19, and return to school when your child has been symptom free for 24 hours. If you require a RAT test kit, please call the school office to arrange pick up.
