Sarah and I would like to welcome everyone back and again wish everyone a Happy New Year. When we went on holiday in December, I'm not sure we were expecting our return to school in January to be such as it was, but here we are again.

I am happy to report that our teachers and staff at RHS have risen to the occasion once again to provide the safest and best learning environment possible under the updated conditions. From prepping on a few days notice to provide remote learning for students, to passing out more than 200 rapid tests to families in two days, to passing out close to fifty Chromebooks to families, to reimagining the learning environments in their classrooms once again to ensure the greatest spacing possible, our teachers continue to work extremely hard and effectively in constantly changing conditions.

We would also like to thank you, our community for doing what you could to arrange for child care and to support your children's learning during the week of remote learning. As we return to school on January 17th, it will be under the Manitoba Pandemic Response System Level Restricted Orange Restoring Safe Schools Orange.

Since the beginning of the year in September, we have actually been working close to the expectations under Restricted Orange and so in preparation for Monday, we are in very good shape and in many ways, it will be "business as usual" because we have gone over and above expectations for Covid safety all year.

We are sending a separate file to review our Level Orange plan. Monday is an inservice day for teachers, but we are very much looking forward to seeing our students on Tuesday and please know that we have their safety at the forefront of our hearts and minds along with their learning.

Physical Education News - Mr. Donato

Throughout the month of December, grades 4 to 6 students learned about the game of Tchoukball. Tchoukball is a net/wall game in which teams attempt to score points by throwing a ball off of a rebounder (net). While the game appears to be an invasion game, it takes on the properties of a net/wall game. Our students had the opportunity to build upon their knowledge of strategy within a net/wall game through this unit. Our grade 5 and 6 students also had the opportunity to try cross-country skiing on our school field. Grade 4 to 6 students finished the month with a variety of low-organized games. Beginning in January, grade 5 and 6 students will have the opportunity to participate in Tchoukball intramurals.

Our grade 1 to 3 students continued to build manipulative skills including throwing and catching skills. Students had the opportunity to develop a variety of transport (running, jumping, hopping, skipping, and galloping) and manipulative (throwing, catching, bouncing, etc.) skills through a variety of low-organized games at the end of the month. A popular low-organized game was snow forts, in which students attempt to throw or roll to knock down the snowmen (pins) and snow forts (hula hoop hut). Students were active, able to learn about teamwork and fair play, and had additional opportunities to develop their rolling and throwing skills.





Grade 6 Students vs. Staff Volleyball

Our grade 6 students had the opportunity to celebrate learning within physical education and through intramurals around the sport of volleyball with a staff vs. grade 6 game.

The grade 6 students faced off against members of the Robert H. Smith staff in a 5-game series, with each grade 6 classroom (rooms 201, 202, 203, 210, and 212) receiving the opportunity to play against our staff.

Congratulations to all our grade 6 students who represented their grade with pride in the return of this annual game.

REGISTRATION FOR 2022/2023

NURSERY

Students registering to begin Nursery in September 2022 must be four years of age by December 31, 2022. A **Birth Certificate, Manitoba Medical Card** and **Proof of Residency (Property Tax Bill)** must be presented at time of registration.

Nursery is considered part of the English track program and, therefore, priority will be given to those within the English catchment area. Those students outside the catchment area will be placed on a waiting list.

KINDERGARTEN

Students registering to begin Kindergarten in September 2022 must be five years of age by December 31, 2022. A **Birth Certificate, Manitoba Medical Card** and **Proof of Residency (Property Tax Bill)** must be presented at time of registration.

Please keep in mind that there are two separate, yet overlapping, catchment areas for French Immersion and English Kindergarten. Priority will be given to those within the catchment area and others will be placed on a waiting list.

Parents of students who are **presently** attending the École Robert H. Smith School Nursery Program and who wish to enroll their child in one of the École Robert H. Smith School Kindergarten programs for the fall **do NOT need to attend** the regular registration session for Kindergarten in 2022. They will receive a letter asking them to indicate their intentions for the next year at the beginning of January 2022.



By the Official Languages Act in 1969-

Presentations on the following programs:

General – The General Program is offered to students attending Grant Park High School starting in grade 7 and continuing through to grade 12. All core subject areas follow the curricula as outlined by Manitoba Education and Training.

Advanced – The Advanced Program provides a disciplined academic environment in which students study subjects in greater depth and at a faster pace. Critical thinking and analysis are emphasized. High academic standards are required and students are expected to maintain a grade of at least 70% in order to continue on to the next grade level. Students must be at, or above, grade level.

Flex - The fundamental approach of the Flexible Learning classroom is to encourage students' natural interests by exploring broad themes within the curricula. Students investigate topics and experience them through discussion, hands-on activities, research, group projects, and a wide variety of related explorations. Flexible Learning classrooms utilize multi-age groupings (grades 7 and 8) and are student-centered, activity-based, and thematically organized. Students must be at, or near, grade level.
