
Since we returned after a short extension to the winter break and one week of remote learning, there have been students needing to isolate at home as a result of either being a close contact or having tested positive for COVID-19. Thank you to parents who reached out to keep us informed when their child will be away and to the teachers who have been providing support to students at home through their google classrooms, see saw and/or work packages sent home.

February is "I Love to Read" month and we have several activities planned for the students. These will range from daily "Drop Everything And Read" (D.E.A.R.) times to some virtual guest readers. We will also be challenging the students to read 200,000 minutes (that is equivalent to approximately 15 minutes per day per person) and the school running total will be graphed on a "stack of books" on display for the students to see. Festival du Voyageur also falls in the month of February and we are in the process of planning some activities to mark this event as well.

The weather usually starts to warm up this month but please continue to refer to he school's Cold Weather Guidelines. Students are expected to take part in outdoor recess when weather permits so please make sure your child is appropriately dressed and their clothing is labeled. There is indoor recess when temperatures drop to -28° C (with the windchill) and colder. REGISTRATION FOR 2022/2023

NURSERY

Students registering to begin Nursery in September 2022 must be four years of age by December 31, 2022. A **Birth Certificate, Manitoba Medical Card** and **Proof of Residency (Property Tax Bill)** must be presented at time of registration.

Nursery is considered part of the English track program and, therefore, priority will be given to those within the English catchment area. Those students outside the catchment area will be placed on a waiting list.

KINDERGARTEN

Students registering to begin Kindergarten in September 2022 must be five years of age by December 31, 2022. A **Birth Certificate, Manitoba Medical Card** and **Proof of Residency (Property Tax Bill)** must be presented at time of registration.

Please keep in mind that there are two separate, yet overlapping, catchment areas for French Immersion and English Kindergarten. Priority will be given to those within the catchment area and others will be placed on a waiting list.

Parents of students who are **presently** attending the École Robert H. Smith School Nursery Program and who wish to enroll their child in one of the École Robert H. Smith School Kindergarten programs for the fall **need to** re-register their students in 2022. They have previously received a letter asking them to indicate their intentions for the next year at the start of January 2022.

Presentations on the following programs:

General – The General Program is offered to students attending Grant Park High School starting in grade 7 and continuing through to grade 12. The General Program is available to all students. All core subject areas follow the curricula as outlined by Manitoba Education and Training.

Advanced – The Advanced Program provides a disciplined academic environment in which students study subjects in greater depth and at a faster pace. Critical thinking and analysis are emphasized. High academic standards are required and students are expected to maintain a grade of at least 70% in order to continue on to the next grade level. Students must be at, or above, grade level. There are specific criteria to be met for acceptance to the program. Flex - The fundamental approach of the Flexible Learning classroom is to encourage students' natural interests by exploring broad themes within the curricula. Students investigate topics and experience them through discussion, hands-on activities, research, group projects, and a wide variety of related explorations. Flexible Learning classrooms utilize multi-age groupings (grades 7 and 8) and are student-centered, activity-based, and thematically organized. Students must be above, at, or near, grade level. There are specific criteria to be met for acceptance to the program.
