Principal Adam Dyck

Adam Dyck may be a familiar face to many River Heights community members as he spent 15 years teaching at Kelvin High School prior to becoming a school administrator. In his time at Kelvin, he taught all of the core courses across multiple grades as well as teaching in the alternative program for several years. He coached boys' soccer and girls' hockey throughout his time at Kelvin and was heavily involved in various other co-curricular activities such as leading Spirit Week and the yearly Rocky Mountain hiking trip.

Adam was long-running chair of the professional development committee and was a leader in the area of content and disciplinary literacy, supporting literacy development in both the English and French Immersion tracks at Kelvin. Adam also brings experience in elementary programming as a teacher, consultant and administrator. He taught grades 5-8 in Airdrie, AB prior to moving to Winnipeg, and provided professional development training to N-9 teachers in Canadian-based bilingual schools in Brazil from 2013-2017 in the areas of classroom management, assessment and planning. He was vice principal of Cecil Rhodes School (N-9) from 2018-2020 and acting Vice Principal at Tec-Voc High School this past year. Adam is experienced in leading in a dual/multi-track environment and has provided professional development training in incorporating language learning in bilingual classrooms during his time in Brazil. Further, he has experience teaching English as an additional language as an English teacher in Japan.

Adam believes that curricular and co-curricular activities such as sports and the performing arts provide opportunities for deeper, authentic learning connected to and supporting academic learning. While Adam is not bilingual in French, he is originally from Ontario and studied French throughout his childhood and is looking forward to brushing up on his French language skills.

He is very excited to come back to his roots in the River Heights community as principal of Ecole Robert H. Smith School.

Sarah Arnold, Directrice adjointe

Sarah spent 20 years as a classroom teacher, at the primary level, at École Sacré Coeur. In 2007, she was part of the French Reading Recovery (IPLÉ) pilot project in Manitoba. The following five years, she taught IPLÉ half time and grade 1 the other half. During her time at Sacré Coeur, she was a member of the literacy, professional development, wellness and workplace health and safety committees as well as the staff representative to the parent council.

In 2012, she trained to become a Reading Recovery Teacher Leader through the Canadian Institute of Reading Recovery (Western Division). She has been a Reading Recovery Teacher Leader for the last eight years, working in both English and French. As part of the Teacher Leader role, she continued to work with students, doing Reading Recovery and/or IPLÉ, and has done so at Isaac Brock, George V and the last three years at Robert H Smith. As a member of the Manitoba Teacher leader team, she has developed and lead frequent professional development sessions for training and continuing Reading Recovery/IPLÉ teachers from the Winnipeg School Division as well as Pembina Trails SD, River East-

Transcona SD, Seine River SD, Lord Selkirk SD, Red River Valley SD, Evergreen SD, Sunrise SD and Brandon SD.

In addition to her role as a Teacher Leader, she has provided professional development at some WSD schools around assessment and early French literacy, in the classroom. She has worked on the WSD Divisional Literacy Committee and the French Curriculum Implementation committee.

She has been an executive member of the Manitoba Early Literacy Intervention Teachers (MELIT) SAGE group since 2014. In this role, she has participated in the planning of the annual MTS PD Day and afterschool professional development sessions.

She looks forward to her new role as Directrice-adjointe at Robert H Smith and getting to know the community.
