Physical Education News from Mr. Donato

Based on recommendations from Public Health, physical education continues to be outside as much as possible. As the weather gets colder, please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for outdoor physical education classes. You child must be wearing footwear which is safe and appropriate for physical education classes (runners while it is still possible). When the snow eventually does fly, please ensure your child has boots which are comfortable and safe for physical activity.

For the past month and a half, each class has had the opportunity to use different packages of equipment. These equipment packages are used by only one class for approximately two weeks, cleaned, and then given to another class. This system has allowed students to continue to build manipulative (throwing, striking, kicking, etc.) skills, as well as some sport-specific skills (e.g., throwing a frisbee, shooting a basketball) for our older students.

All physical education games and activities continue to follow public health guidelines for physical activity and sport. In the event of poor weather, classes have moved into the gym. If classes must take place inside, all students maintain two meters of distance apart throughout the class.

HALLOWEEN TIPS DURING COVID-19



Keep two metres distance from others

Students

- Keep two metres distance from others.
- Wear a non-medical mask.
- Make your non-medical mask part of your costume.
- Keep your eyes unobstructed for safety.
- Be sure to wash your hands very well before eating Halloween treats.
- If you start to feel unwell when out trick or treating, return home as soon as possible.



Caregivers and Teachers

- Use tongs to distribute candy.
- Wear a non-medical mask when giving out treats.
- Provide individual bags and avoid self-service such as a common candy bowl.
- Provide wrapped, store bought treats only for trick or treaters.
- Frequently clean and disinfect common touch surfaces.
- Encourage hand hygiene prior to food service by placing an alcohol-based hand sanitizer near the food service area.
- Have one person designated to serve food to guests to reduce the sharing of utensils.

Anybody who feels unwell should not take part in Halloween activities.
