<u>St. John's High School student awarded largest Canadian STEM scholarship</u> Now in its 10<sup>th</sup> year, 100 scholarship will be awarded this year

Winnipeg, MB June 16, 2021 --- Darlene Cuevas has been selected to receive a \$100,000 **Schulich Leader Scholarship** to study Engineering at University of Manitoba.

A graduate of Winnipeg School Division's St. John's High School in Winnipeg, Cuevas will be entering the Faculty of Engineering this Fall. Cuevas was selected by Phoebe Proven for her outstanding academic achievements. This is the **first** Nominee to win a Schulich Leader Scholarship at St. John's High School.
