The construction is complete and things look wonderful! One of the changes includes a buzz in system for our main entrance. All our exterior doors will be locked except for the main entrance. The main front exterior door (daycare entrance) will be unlocked but the interior exit door will be locked. There is a buzz in system to get into the school. We will have your child come to meet you there so that classes are not disrupted.

Just a reminder to all families and students that cell phones are not permitted for use on school property during the school day. We understand that students may have a cell phone for safety reasons for walking to and from school. That is certainly allowed, but once on school grounds phones must be turned off and stored in backpacks. Students found using their phones during the school day, will have the phone taken away and parents will be responsible for picking up the phone from the office.

Please remember it is extremely important for students to be at school on time so they do not miss instructional time.

#### Office Hours

The office is open from 7:30 - 11:30 a.m. and from 12:30 - 3:30 p.m. During the lunch hour, messages may be left on our school answering machine.



#### **Late Arrivals**

If your child arrives late please bring them to the daycare entrance doors to get buzzed into the school. They will then need to stop at the office for a late slip to insure their attendance is correct for the day.



## **Early Pick Up**



Should you need to drop off or pick up your child during the day, we have a new buzz-in system at the northeast doors (main daycare entrance). We ask that

you buzz the office, proceed to the office. We will get your child out of class and have them meet you at the office.

#### **Transportation**

If your child takes the school bus from school it is important that you advise the school office if they will not be on the bus for a particular day. If there is no



phone call or note, your child will be placed on the bus.

Please inform us before 10:40 a.m. and 2:40 p.m.

## **School Doors**

All our exterior doors will be locked after 8:45 a.m. The main front exterior door (daycare entrance) will be unlocked but the interior exit door will be locked. There is a buzz in system to get into the school. If you do need to pick your child

up during the regular school day, please use the main entrance, and then proceed to the office. We will have your child come to meet you there so that classes are not disrupted.

#### SafeArrival Reminders

#### Some pointers about SafeArrival:

- Calls to the system need to be done by 8:30 a.m. for full day or morning absences, and by 12:30 p.m. for afternoon absences.
- If your child is going to be late, please put it in the system as there is a Late option. This will avoid you receiving a call from the system after 8:30 a.m. or 12:30 p.m.
- When using the telephone system to put in an absence, please make sure you receive a confirmation number. If you do not receive a confirmation number the absence has not been recorded.



#### You can access SafeArrival in one of three ways:

- Parents can call into an automated interactive telephone system via a toll free number (1-855-278-4513) through which absences can be reported.
- Parents can log into a website, go.schoolmessenger.com to authenticate their Portal account to report absences and update contact information.
- Parents who have authenticated their accounts and have either an iOS or Android device can download the **SchoolMessenger App** that can be used to report absences.

The system is available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. Future absences can be reported at any time.

## **Crossing Guard**



Our adult crossing guard is Mme Karen. She will be on duty on Grant Avenue from 8:05 - 8:30 a.m., and from 3:00 - 3:15 p.m. Please feel

free to say "Bonjour!" (Hello!) or "À demain!" (See you tomorrow!) to her each day!

#### **School Patrols**

Our patrols monitor and cross pedestrians across Grant Avenue. In the morning the patrols are on post from 8:05 - 8:20 a.m. After school, patrols are on from 3:00- 3:15 p.m.



Please teach your children to cross the street where and when patrols are working. Encourage your children to respect student patrols and adult crossing guards.

## **Parking**



We want all children to have a safe arrival and departure from school! The school parking lot is not available for visitor parking at this time. All spots are reserved and paid for by staff. Some staff members come and go

throughout the day. Please do not use these staff parking spots for pick-up or drop-off.

We would suggest the following areas for parking:

- Brock Street just east of the school
- Cordova Street across Grant Avenue and cross with the lights at the pedestrian crossing
- The parking lot in the southwest corner of our playground and walking across the field.

## **Child Custody**

Child custody in most cases, when parents are divorced, both mother and father continue to have equal rights where their children are concerned. If you have a court

order that limits the rights of one parent in matters such as custody or visitation, please bring a copy to the office. Unless your court order is on file with us, we must provide equal rights to both parents.

## Health Care Plans and Medication for Students

Each child with special health care needs, such as allergies, asthma, or other needs requires a **Health Care Plan**. The plan gives detailed information so the school may respond to your child's needs. Please inform the school if your child has any special health care needs.



We know that from time to time, children may need to receive medication while at school. We are happy to oblige, within Winnipeg School Division policy. The school is able to provide medication, that is prescribed by a health care provider, **upon completion of the required forms**. All

medication **must be in the original container with the child's name** on it. Please speak with the office for more information.

## **Pets on School Grounds**

Winnipeg School Division policy states that only certified service dogs may be permitted on school grounds. Walking to school with your dog is a terrific family activity and will leave you with many wonderful memories. However, please ensure your family pet is not brought onto the school property.



## **Emergency Practices**



During the course of a school year, we are mandated to practice 10 Fire Drills (1 per month) and also prepare children in the school for a Lockdown in

the event there is an emergency within the school. We also take the time during the school year to practice a total school **Evacuation**. Our offsite safe location is Brock Corydon School.

Staff will always debrief with children after every drill for all emergency measure practices. Please do not hesitate to call the school if you need any clarification.

## **Elementary Assessment Program**



Each fall, our teachers assess each student, using the Winnipeg School Division Elementary Assessment Program. Students' social-emotional development and motor development are observed, and progress in Mathematics and French Language

Arts is noted. This assessment gives teachers important information to determine needs and help plan instruction for future student growth. Please feel free to talk with your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions about your child's development or the Elementary Assessment Program.

## **Clinical Support Services (CSS)**

The Winnipeg School Division Clinical Support Services provides specialists to all Winnipeg School Division schools, to assist students who require additional support to be successful in



school. Our CSS clinicians will work with students who meet criteria, and only when it is recommended by school staff and with parental consent.

#### Lost and Found

Each year, hundreds of articles find their way to the lost and found bin. To reduce losses we suggest that all students' articles be labeled, especially outdoor clothing and boots. It is difficult even for adults to identify articles which they have not seen for some time. Since a considerable number of students' belongings remain in the school it is important that they be identifiable. Lost



items can be found on the rack located outside of the office. Small items like jewelry, keys, etc. can be found in the office.

#### **Student Fees**

Nursery and kindergarten parents are reminded to send \$60.00 to their child's classroom teacher as soon as possible for school supplies and field trips. Grades 1 - 6 students are asked to pay \$70.00.



#### **Student Accident Insurance**



Student Accident Insurance forms are being sent home. If you are interested in having your child covered by the plan, please fill out the form and mail it directly to the company using the return addressed envelope, or apply online at <a href="https://www.studentaccidentinsurance.ca">www.studentaccidentinsurance.ca</a>. We encourage you to take advantage of the program. The plan is effective 12 months of the year.

## Milk Program

White milk (250 mL) is available during the lunch hour (Wednesday's, chocolate milk). Students must be signed up to receive milk on a daily basis. If you are interested and have not already signed up forms are available in the school office or on our website.

The cost of milk for the year is \$50.00, or 2 payments of \$25.00. If your child would like to receive just chocolate milk it is \$10.00.

Please make cheques payable to École Sir William Osler Lunch Program.

## **Lunch Program**

The supervision of students during the lunch hour is the responsibility of the École Sir William Osler Lunch Program which is run by the Parent Advisory Council.

All children, attending the lunch program at École Sir William Osler must have a registration form completed in order to attend. These forms are available from our office or our website if you have not completed it yet.

All students, will eat lunch in their classroom. The parent run committee collaborates with all parents to meet the needs of École Sir William Osler students throughout the school year.

**Microwaves will not be available**. If you would like your child to have something warm, please heat it at home and put it in a thermos or thermal container.

The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year.



Orange Shirt Day represents an opportunity for First Nations, École Sir William Olser, and the River Heights community to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.
